Former teacher sentenced on sex charges

Former Souderton Area High School teacher Carl E. Sieke was sentenced Monday to 3½ to 10 years in state prison for engaging in deviate sexual intercourse with four pre-teen boys in his home during 1982.

Montgomery County Judge Anthony Scirica sentenced Sieke, 37, a former Boy Scout leader, camp counselor and physics teacher at Souderton Area High School for 14 years.

**Seke pleaded guilty to involuntary deviate sexual intercourse in December 1983. He was arrested in November 1982 after two boys, 8 and 9 years old, told their mothers that Sieke had performed oral sex with them in October

Sieke, a bachelor, testified during the sentencing hearing that his problem began insidiously and went out of control before he knew what was happening.

"I know there are people in Souderton who want to string me up. I don't blame them a bit. I would probably think the same thing," Sieke testified.

Formerly of Fourth St. in Souderton Borough. Sieke testified he has lived with his parents in Springfield. Delaware County, since his arrest. Sieke also said he has joined a gay group in Philadelphia.

While he was at Souderton Area High. Sieke testified, he was regarded as one of the best teachers there. He resigned after his arrest.

Sieke testified he had deviate sex with 20 young

boys over a period of 15 years.

After Sieke's arrest in connection with the 8- and 9-year-old boys, detectives linked him to activities with two other pre-teen boys that occurred from mid-1979 to mid-1981.

Detectives found 8mm films of young boys and photos of nude boys, some of which included Sieke, in Sieke's Souderton home. Assistant district attorney Alan Bailey said an elementary shoool teacher in the Souderton district identified some of those boys as local children, which led to the two additional arrests.

Bailey recommended a 5- to 19-year sentence for Sieke, while Sieke's lawyer, Francis Ricchuitti, recommended a long period of probation and thousands of hours of community service.

Area teacher pleads qui

A former Souderton Area High School physics teacher and Boy Scoutleader pleaded guilty Thursday to having deviate sexual intercourse with four pre-teen boys in his home.

Carl E. Sieke, 39, entered his plea. before Montgomery County Judge Anthony Scirica, who ordered a presentence investigation and one-day psychiatric evaluation at Norristown State Hospital.

Sieke, described at the time of his arrest as a man who was so trusted in the community that parents allowed their children to stay overnight with him, could get up to 40 to 80 years in prison.

First assistant district attorney G. Alan Bailey said Thursday he has received dozens of "strong letters and petitions" from residents of Souderton, Telford and Harleysville pressing him to prosecute the case to the fullest and get Sieke's \$50,000 bail increased. Bailey said Sieke is now free on \$68,000 since his parents posted their house in Springfield, Delaware County, where Sieke is now living.

Bailey said Sieke is taking graduate courses in computer science at VII-lanova University, but he did not know if Sieke has a job.

Charges of indecent assault, corruption of minors and endangering the welfare of children were dropped Thursday, Bailey said.

Sleke was arrested in November 1982 after two boys, 8 and 9 years old, told their mothers Sleke had performed oral sex with them in October. Bailey said. The boys gave statements to county detectives that Nov. 24, Bailey said.

Detectives found 8mm films of young boys, and photos of nude boys, some of which included Sieke himself, in Sieke's former home on Fourth St. in Souderton Borough, Bailey said.

Bailey said an elementary schoolteacher in the Souderton district identified some boys in the photos as local children, which led to Sieke's arrest on two other deviate sex charges. Those acts with pre-teen boys occurred from mid-1979 to mid-1981, Bailey sàid.

Upon his arrest, Sieke, a bachelor, resigned after 14 years of teaching. Authorities have said children enjoyed visiting Sieke's home because he kept snakes and had video games.



Sex molester gets term of $3\frac{1}{2}$ -10 years

Carl Eric Sleke, 37, who also was a
Boy Scout leader and a camp counselor in the Souderton area, pleaded
guilty before Montgomery County
Judge Anthony J. Scirica on Dec. 1 to
Four counts of involuntary deviate
sexual intercourse.

First Assistant District Attorney G. Alan Bailey said Sieke was charged with committing various sexual acts with the boys, who were between the ages of eight and 12, after luring them into his home on the first block of Fourth Street, Souderton, under the pretext of letting them play video games. Bailey said Sieke kept diaries of his exploits and that he had taken pornographic photographs of the boys.

Sleke, who now lives with his parents at their home in Springfield, Delaware County, resigned from his post af Souderton High after his arrest in November 1982. He had been a physics teacher at the high school for 14 years.

Cooking pale and drawn, Sleke told Scirica at the sentencing hearing that he had sexual relationships with about 20 young boys over a period of about 15 years, beginning when he was a counselor at a summer camp in Montgomery County.

"The problem began so insidiously that I was completely out of control before I realized what was happening," Sieke said.

"I know there are people in the community who want to string me up. I don't blame them a bit."

Bailey said that investigators became aware of Sieke's behavior when two of the boys told their parents they had been abused, and that the parents reported the incidents to police. He said that at least two victims have developed psychological problems as a result of the incidents and are undergoing therapy.

After acknowledging that Sleke had been regarded as an excellent teacher and had an IQ of over 150, Scirica said yesterday that "I can't help remark that a person with your insights should have known better."

Sleke's attorney, Francis Recchuiti, said yesterday that he would appeal the sentence on the ground that it was overly harsh.

Montco teacher charged with molesting 2 boys at his home

A teacher at Souderton High School has been arrested on charges that he lured two young boys to his home last month on the pretext that they would play video games and then sexually molested them. Montgomery County authorities said yesterday.

Detectives for the Montgomery

Detectives said the teacher, Carl Eric Sieke, 38, who also served as a Boy Scout leader in Montgomery County and a camp counselor, was arrested Friday at his home in the first block of Fourth Street, Souderton.

Detectives said Sieke was charged with two counts each of involuntary deviate sexual intercourse, indecent assault, corruption of minors and endangering the welfare of children.

Former teacher arraigned on charges of molestation

A former teacher at Souderton High School who was arrested last month on charges of sexually molesting two young boys has been charged with similar offenses involving two other youths, Montgomery County District Attorney Joseph A. Smyth Jr., announced yesterday.

Smyth said Carl Eric Sieke, 38, of the first block of Fourth Street, Souderton, was released on \$70,000 ball after his arraignment yesterday on charges of involuntary deviate sexual intercourse, corruption of minors, indecent exposure and other charges

According to police records, Sieke, who was also a Boy Scout leader and a camp counselor, is charged with having sexual intercourse with the two boys; ages-16 and 17, in May-1981 and on, other occasions during the two years before that. Sieke, who resigned from Souderton High School three days after his arrest, was originally charged with sexually molesting two boys, an 8-year-old, on Oct. 30 and Oct. 31, 1982.

Sieke was arraigned on Friday morning before Justice Musselman and charged with two counts of involuntary deviate sexual intercourse, indecent assault, corruption of minors and endangering the welfare of children.

Sieke submitted his resignation on Monday, and cleared out his collection of snakes and rats which he has used for a number of years in experiments and educational programs for his physics students.

Dr. William Maxwell, superintendent, said Sieke was expected to clear out his personal effects this week, and be is being replaced by a temporary substitute, Keith Rosenberger, who holds a BS in physics from Lehigh.

Both Dr. Maxwell and High School Principal Albert Mancini expressed shock over the charges against Sieke, a respected teacher who had built the physics program over the years from three to five sections due to the demand for the course.

Mancini said, "This thing

Mancini said, "This thing caught me by surpise. The guy was an excellent teacher and the kids liked him. He really built up the physics program."

The arrest of Sieke came after the parents of the two youths came to the Child and Youth Services Department of Montgomery County to report the alleged sexual abuse which had taken place over a two-month period when the boys visited the Sieke home for several hours each day.

The youths originally had told a friend of their encounters with Sieke, and then told parents of the incidents including actual sex acts on Oct. 30 and 31. The youths said the visits to the home included the making and viewing of pornographic pictures, picture-taking sessions, and the viewing of pornographic books. Sieke had saked the youths to keep the acts a secret.

After the alleged incidents were reported to the Child and Youth Services, a representative of the department went to the Montgomery County District Attorney's office which ordered an investigation by the Sex Crimes Unit.

Edward Schneegas. Montgomery County Detective, said after several days of investigation with the Souderton police they had sufficient information confiscated from the home were diaries dating back to 1975 outlining sexual activities with various young boys. Polaroid shots of sex acts with young boys and 41 child pornographic books along with other pornography materials.

Schneegas said, "He's been doing this for a long time." The detective said his department is conducting an ongoing investigation and will attempt to identify persons in the various photographs and films found in the home. Scheegas said Sieke was not making the films and pictures for distribution.

Schneegas said that everything the former teacher did involved young boys, as he was a Boy Scout leader. Big Brother and camp counselor. Sieke had the respect and trust of the community and youths often visited his home to play video games, ping pong, camp out in

his back yard, or view the various reptiles and rodents he kept as pets. Some of the materials confiscated from the home show evidence of the use of the snakes in some of the encounters.

Police are now sorting through his files of pictures and diaries detailing his encounters, something typical of "pedophilla," according to police.

The charges against Sieke have attracted the attention of Philadelphia television news crews who attempted to interview Souderton administrators, students and Sieke's neighbors. The TV crews were told to leave the high school by the administration in that they were disrupting the school day.

On a television interview with an elderly neighbor of Sieke's the woman alleged that the Souderton Borough police 'knew

charged in sex crimes

SOUDERTON — A former Souderton Area High School physics teacher is free on \$50,000 bail after his arrest Friday for allegedly sexually assaulting two borough youths at his home.

Carl E. Sieke, 36, of 49 Fourth St., Souderton, was charged with two counts each of voluntary deviant sexual intercourse, indecent assault, corruption of minors and endangering the welfare of children. Detectives from the Montgomery County District Attorney's office in Norristown arrested Sieke after a search of his residence uncovered child pornography items and diaries the teacher allegedly kept involving his sexual encounters with young boys over the past seven years.

Sicke's arrest was the result of Oct. 30 and 31 incidents involving an 8- and 9-year-old boys at Sicke's home. County detectives said Sicke reportedly lured the children to his house promising them they could play video games, and then sexually molested them. The children then told their parents about the incident, who then notified law enforcement authorities.

Montgomery County Detective Edward H. Schneegas, of the sex crimes unit, said police are investigating numerous other incidents involving young boys and additional charges may be filed at a later date.

"We're working on it right now as far as the information goes," said Schneegas.

Sleke is scheduled to appear Monday, Dec. 8 at 3 p.m. before District Justice Grant Musselman, of Souderton, for a preliminary hearing.

According to school administrators, Sieke was well liked by students and his fellow staff during his 13-year tenure as a district employee.

"He was an excellent teacher," according to Souderton Area High School principal Albert Mancini. "The kids liked him and he had a wonderful program going here."

Mancini said when Sieke was hired, he taught courses in both physics and physical science, but an additional teacher was hired to take over the physical science program since his physics course became so popular.

Mancini estimated about 100 or 150 seniors and accelerated 11th graders were presently being taught physics by Sieke.

Sieke also was involved with an inschool club dealing with snakes. The club met during activity periods on school time.

Both Mancini and Schools' Superintendent Dr. William E. Maxwell confirmed that Sieke formally submitted his resignation on Monday and has not been to classes since school recessed for the Thanksgiving holidays last Wednesday. A substitute teacher will take his place until the school board hires a replacement, most likely at its next meeting.

Maxwell said Sieke came to the district from Delaware County. After talking with Sieke at his arraignment Friday, Maxwell said Sieke has moved from his borough home back to his parents' Delaware County home.

"From observations I've read and reports, he was an outstanding teacher in the classroom," said the superintendent who recently submitted his resignation and plans to retire soon. "We've had no indications of his alleged proclivities and, frankly, it was quite a shock. As far as we knew, he was a rather nice young man."

Sieke was also a Boy Scout leader for Troop 91, which included youngsters in the Harleysville and Souderton-Telford area.
