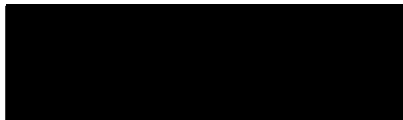

On October 10, 1977, Charles Raymond Haskett appeared with his counsel, R. A. Scardino, and entered a plea of guilty to the above offense. The District Attorney did not make a recommendation. Sentencing was deferred pending a pre-sentence investigation.

I. PRESENT OFFENSE

The following is a summary of Houston Police Department offense report number K-48256:

On July 30, 1977, a complaint was made by [redacted] age 12, and his mother, [redacted]. Their complaint alleged that the defendant had fondled the genitals of [redacted] on or about the last weekend in July. He was spending the night at the defendant's home and the defendant's parents were out of town. [redacted] was awakened by the defendant who had his hands between [redacted] legs and was playing with him there. [redacted] told him to stop and he did. Later, [redacted] was reawakened because the defendant was doing this same thing again.

The defendant took [redacted] home the following morning. Sometime later that day the boy told his mother what had happened. [redacted] also told a friend of the family, [redacted] and his babysitter; [redacted]

I. PRESENT OFFENSE (Continued)

On August 2, 1977, officers went to the home of the defendant's parents at [REDACTED] Houston, Texas. There they placed the defendant under arrest. He was charged with Indecency With a Child and bond was set at \$1,000.00. On August 4, 1977, the defendant was released on a personal recognizance bond and he has remained free pending disposition of the charges.

II. DEFENDANT'S STATEMENT TO THE PROBATION OFFICER

The following is the defendant's statement exactly as he wrote it:

"On the evening of the offense, [REDACTED] came to my house to spend the night. I don't remember exactly what had prompted his spending the night there. I had made some suggestion about sleeping arrangements and he had decided to sleep in the bed next to me. We went to sleep without incident. On one previous occasion he had spent the night and had joked about his genitals commenting that he and a babysitter had names for each others' genitals and played around occasionally. I thought little of it and he and I joked about it. On the morning of the offense, I woke before [REDACTED]. After being awake for several minutes I decided to wake him but he was fairly drowsy. I began horsing around with him and did touch his genitals in order to get a reaction from him. I realize now that I shouldn't have, but at the time I did not give it much significance and I do not feel that I was motivated by any sexual interest. At one point he did react and indicated he did not want me to do such things and I immediately stopped."

III. PRIOR RECORD

The defendant does not have a juvenile record.

IV. OTHER INFORMATION

This officer spoke with [REDACTED]. She and her son had known the defendant approximately eight months. He was working with [REDACTED] as a tutor and teacher's aid and they became friends. [REDACTED] is a widow and did not discourage the friendship, as she felt the child needed male companionship. The defendant was always polite and mannerly and he paid a lot of attention to the child. She thought he was rather peculiar, as he did not date, but he did not seem "queer" to her. Just as a precaution, she told [REDACTED] to tell her if anyone ever touched him, but she did not refer specifically to the defendant.

Following the offense, [REDACTED] had some emotional problems. He was afraid to return to school and he was afraid of men. His grades also dropped. He seems to be doing better now and he has joined the big brother program.

[REDACTED] mentioned that the defendant had a friend named [REDACTED] who is a homosexual. [REDACTED] met him through the defendant and appeared to be afraid of him. [REDACTED] thought the defendant might be better off if he did not see Santos again.

This officer then spoke with Sally Layland, supervisor of the 174th District Court Adult Probation Unit. She supervises Alonzo Santos. On November 30, 1976, he received a ten year probation for Indecency With a Child. She said he is a homosexual and likes little boys. He had listed the defendant as a character reference. She stated that she would advise him to terminate all relationships with the defendant.

V. PERSONAL HISTORY

A. Family History

The defendant is the youngest of three children born to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] is a [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] is a housewife. It is a stable, middle class, religious family. The defendant stated that he was given a good upbringing and a good education in spite of the fact that the family moved frequently.

B. Marital History

The defendant has never been married.

C. Family Relationships

This officer spoke with the defendant's mother. She described him as a good, loving child who was well liked and a good student. He began having difficulties in college and she sent him to a psychiatrist, who said he had an identity problem.

[REDACTED] described the defendant as a sexually inexperienced man who needed guidance but had no one to turn to. Her husband is extremely shy and modest and cannot discuss these matters. In fact, it appears that there is little personal communication of any kind in the home.

D. Education

The defendant graduated from Bellaire High School in 1967. School records verify a better than average student with an I.Q. of 128. He enrolled in Rice University and attended off and on until 1972, when he had an enforced withdrawal for academic reasons. During this period, he also completed 21 hours at the University of St. Thomas. He then enrolled at North Texas State University in 1973, and remained there until December, 1974. At the present time he is a senior at the University of Houston. He is majoring in Sociology and will graduate this December.

B. Religion

The defendant irregularly attends Memorial Drive Presbyterian Church.

F. Personal Health

1. Physical

The defendant's physical health is good.

2. Mental and Emotional

The defendant saw Dr. Lawrence Cassard, a psychiatrist at the Baylor School of Medicine, for approximately nine months in 1968 and 1969. Dr. Cassard did not respond to our request for information.

On October 11, 1977, the defendant was evaluated by Dr. Richard B. Pesikoff, a psychiatrist. Dr. Pesikoff's impression of the defendant was an inadequate character disorder, moderately severe with probable sexual perversion. He recommended intense psychiatric treatment. His report is attached for the Court's review.

On November 15, 1977, the defendant began a series of tests at the Baylor Psychiatric Clinic. When the tests are completed he will begin psychiatric therapy. The clinic is located at [REDACTED] Houston, Texas [REDACTED]

H. Economic Situation

The defendant earns \$400.00 per month and lives at home. His lawyer charged him \$2,000.00 and he has paid half of this amount.

I. Narcotic, Drug and Alcohol Experience

The defendant drinks occasionally. He denies the use of any drugs at the present time.

Approximately nine years ago, the defendant experimented with marijuana, LSD and amphetamines. This experimentation lasted only a short time.

J. Military Experience

The defendant has no military experience.

VI. PLANS

The defendant hopes to complete his degree and to continue teaching piano and guitar.

VII. PROBATION OFFICER'S IMPRESSION

The defendant, Charles Haskett, is a 28-year-old man who stood before the Court and entered a plea of guilty to Indecency With a Child. He has no prior felony or misdemeanor convictions.

The defendant is a quiet, polite, intelligent middle class man who appears to have emotional problems. He has never experienced a sexual relationship, either heterosexual or homosexual. His emotional growth appears to have been arrested in adolescence. His family background is almost puritanical. The present offense is a direct result of his emotional illness compounded by his family's lack of communication.

VII. PROBATION OFFICER'S IMPRESSION (Continued)

The defendant has started into a program of psychiatric therapy through the Baylor Psychiatric Clinic. He is also completing his education at the University of Houston and is working part time. He has the intelligence and motivation to work with a psychiatrist and this appears to be the most positive course of action.

It is the recommendation of this officer that the defendant be granted Adult Probation and that he be stipulated into therapy at the Baylor Psychiatric Clinic until such time as his psychiatrist and the Court feel he can no longer benefit from treatment.

Dear Mr. Scardino:

Charles Haskett was seen in my office for a psychiatric evaluation on October 11, 1977, and the following is a report of my findings.

Mr. Haskett is a 28 year old male who indicates that he was charged with "indecent with a child" about a month and a half ago.

Mr. Haskett indicates that he teaches music privately, has worked with children and that because of his affection and care for children that his behavior could be misinterpreted as something that it was not. He says that he is supposed to have touched a boy named [REDACTED] "in the wrong places". He indicates that [REDACTED] was said to have been asleep at the time and the patient doesn't feel that he has any sexual interest with children but does care a lot about children.

The patient is currently in school where he is obtaining his B.A. degree from the University of Houston. He is currently living with his parents and indicates that he does get involved with children, that he is oriented towards children but that he doesn't feel he has any sexual interest in children.

The patient does have a previous history of arrests having worked at the Harris County Youth Village from 1974-1975 as a dorm parent. He was suspected of some involvement with a teenager and he was discharged from this position.

He indicates that he has never been married and has had a brief period of psychotherapy in 1968 with a psychiatrist Dr. Lawrence Cassard.

The patient has no history of heterosexual or homosexual activity. There is no drug history and no alcohol problems.

Family History: The patient's father is a man in his late 50's and works as a [REDACTED] and the patient feels that he is not real close to him. The patient's mother is in her late 50's at home and he indicates that she "aggravates me a lot and is extremely dominating". He feels that she is over protective. In addition to the patient, he has an older sister [REDACTED] and an older brother [REDACTED].

The patient works as a piano teacher and plays the guitar. He states that he has some friends and in his future he hopes to be able to get involved with girls, loose weight, marry, and get a job after college.

Mental Status: The patient presents as an alert, oriented, white, nervous, 28 year old male. He was dressed appropriately but was about 90 pounds overweight. He had frequent nervous laugh and immature affect. He had a childlike qualities and became frightened in the session and tried to entertain the examiner at times. His walk and gait were normal and there were no abnormal gestures or mannerisms. His speech was relevant and logical and there were no psychotic manifestations. His IQ was in the superior range. His memory was intact for recent and remote events and his judgment was fair. He became circumstantial often when answering questions and keeps attempting to build himself up.

Impression: Inadequate character disorder moderately severe in degree with sexual perversion most probably. The question at this point is whether or not this individual has a borderline psychiatric disorder.

Recommendation: This is an individual because of his poor interpersonal relationships, poor sexual history, difficulties developing a career, his inability to separate from his parents, is in serious need of psychiatric treatment. I don't feel that he is a serious threat to anybody in a physical way but certainly should receive intense psychiatric treatment. This could conceivably be made part of any court ruling forthcoming.

Dear Sirs:

In reply to your letter dated 11/7/77 (and just received today), I am enclosing a copy of Mr Hockett's Psychological Evaluation performed in June, 1968.

Diagnosis at the time, confirmed by the above psychological testing, was Borderline Character in late adolescence. In his therapy sessions with me he did reveal evidence of a psychotic process with thought disorder as well as his seriously disordered behavior. Unfortunately therapy was discontinued unilaterally by Mr Hockett after about 2 1/2 mo. and it was not possible to get him in to therapy, in any prolonged way after that. Prognosis was considered to be poor without therapy and guarded if therapy could have been continued.

I hope that this information will be of value to this young man, and hope may be able to get the appropriate help.

Psychological Evaluation

Name: Charles Hasket
Age: 18

Tests Administered: Rorschach, TAT, Sentence Completion, MMPI

Results: This patient's performance on tests suggests that he is making a borderline adjustment although he may not be showing any overt psychotic signs. Little evidence supports substantial ego strength and considerable evidence supports inadequate coping techniques. There is a distinct possibility of underlying disorganization.

His behavior during the examination was marked by the presence of psychomotor retardation. He was excessively unproductive and indecisive unless explicitly prodded to respond. His manner was friendly and responsive and there were relatively few indicants of anxiety, and he described himself as socially "extremely well adjusted". In general, he had very little to report with respect to what his disturbance might be. He said things such as "I am incapable of anger" or "I feel comfortable all the time", confessing however, to a "fantastic inferiority complex".

Responses on the Rorschach suggested several problem areas. One of these is an underlying sexual problem which was manifested by repeated percepts both covertly and overtly sexual. Most of these had to do with the male sexual organ, but not exclusively. At one point he referred to the "female mannmary gland" and on many occasions to the pelvis. The latter response occurred so frequently that a per-servervative tendency was suggested. Sexual responses particularly those involving the male organ were followed by responses which seemed more disorganized and suggested a loss of control.

Although the patient presented a passive and comfortable demeanor, responses on the Rorschach suggested considerable underlying drive, substantial sense of insecurity and threat, sometimes to the extent of suggesting a sense of personal danger. These feelings of insecurity and anxiety may go so far as to involve some suspiciousness and projection. The impression was gained that there might be considerable fluctuation between levels of excitation and inhibition and control. At times he is apt to be rather remote from others, even though his reality contact may not necessarily be impaired. The reported feelings of inadequacy were substantiated in his responses to the ink blots.

Perhaps the most prominent defense is denial backed by some degree of negativism. In this connection the maternal figure seems to play a particularly important role for it is her control which he is most concerned to evade. Although his failure in performance is reflected in his responses to the tests not only in the sense that he did not do as much or as fluently as others do, but also in the content of his responses, he nevertheless denied having oppositional tendencies. Lack of motivation is also suggested as underlying the negative aspects. He is evidently attempting to resolve some confusion he has with respect to the relative authority of the two parental roles by being rebellious and possibly by pitting these two authorities against each other. In particular it would seem that some disappointment with his dependency on his mother plays an important role in his attitude about her and her attempts to control him. There is a considerable amount of rigidity in these interpersonal situations as depicted in stories he tells on the TAT. For example, a figure in the role of a son, he has described as "demanding" and "resolute", very reluctant to relinquish this position. Rebellious attitudes do not seem to be a source of pleasure in the usual sense to the patient because he repeatedly described feelings of frustration, shame and hurt in connection with authority. At a deeper level more clear cut hostility appears, but he has denied these hostile feelings massively. Perhaps the most telling example concerns a story in which a character has been injured and another character is described as "having something to gain by the other's death". No evidence of guilt was noted in the story. Problems commented on earlier are also reflected in a TAT story of sexual content concerned principally with inability to perform sexually and dissatisfaction with regard to sex.

This patient is in need of continuous psychotherapy for some period of time. He would be expected on the grounds of rather massive denial to have some difficulties accepting this form of treatment. It would also seem that he might have difficulty coordinating self-knowledge with behavior. There seems at the present time to be a dual source for his difficulties. One of them is possibly one of exacerbation, having to do with the need for him to manage sexual excitation. He is evidently not capable of dealing with these feelings. The other is a more long standing problem, involving hostility and dependency, particularly with regard to his mother. Although he is presently not overtly psychotic in terms of his test performance, his abilities to function and cope are sufficiently fragile, that the future might pretend a possible breakdown.
