To Whom it May Concern:

On June 2, 1988 I received a letter from Douglas Stewart, President of Penn's Woods Council, BSA stating that my membership with the Boy Scouts of America was suspended. The council did not tell me what the reason was, but that I should write to them telling my version of the facts supporting my claim that my registration should not be suspended, and that their decission could be reviewed at my request. I wrote to them at the end of July and I received NO reply. I wrote again on August 31, 1988 and still no reply. I wrote again on September 21, 1988 and finally on October 4, 1988 came an answer. The council claimed that they reveiwed their decision and that my registration would not be accepted. They would not give me any reason. How was I supposed to defend myself before their review if I did not know what I was charged with?

The committee of Troop 110 (which I was registered with) agrees with me on this. If you want to check with the Troop committee please write to: George Molnar
