The County Attorney's office warved the kitnapping charge and the man in question pleaded guilty to the attempted sodomy charge and was sentenced last week to one year in the County Workhouse.

Also, I met with the Troop Committee of Troop 159 from our council last week, and we have agreed that Mr. Sheehan will continue to serve as Scoutmaster "on probation" until 1972. You had written about a month ago to Norman Swails about this case.

EXTRACTS FROM THE CHARTER AND BYLAWS OF THE BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

Granting Commissions and Certificates of Membership

All persons serving in any official relationship with the Boy Scouts of America shall subscribe to the statement of religious principle . . . the Scout Oath and Law, and these Bylaws. Such persons shall be citizens of the United States, or . . . shall have legally declared their intentions to become citizens of the United States, or, in the case of minors, shall take an oath of allegiance to the flag and Government of the United States, or shall satisfy the requirements of Article XVI, Section 6, Clause 4 with respect to visiting adult aliens. Article XVIII, Section

Character Development, Citizenship Training, Mental and Physical Fitness

The purpose of the Corporation is as set forth in the original certificate of incorporation under the laws of the District of Columbia, dated February 8, 1910, and restated in the Act of Incorporation enacted by the Congress of the United States of America on June 15, 1916, as follows: "That the purpose of this corporation shall be to promote, through organization, and cooperation with other agencies, the ability of boys to do things for themselves and others, to train them in Scoutcraft, and to teach them patriotism, courage, self-reliance, and kindred virtues, using the methods which are now in common use by Boy Scouts." In achieving this purpose, emphasis shall be placed upon its educational program and the oaths, promises, and codes of the Scout program for character development, citizenship training, mental and physical fitness. Article I, Section 2.

Declaration of Religious Principle

The Boy Scouts of America maintains that no boy can grow into the best kind of citizen without recognizing his obligation to God. In the first part of the Scout Oath or Promise the boy declares, "On my honor. I will do my best to do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law." The recognition, of God as the ruling and leading power in the universe and the grateful acknowledgment of His lavors and blessings are necessary to the best type of citizenship and are wholesome precepts in the education of the growing boy. No matter what the religious faith of the boy may be, this fundamental need of good citizenskip should be kept before him. The Boy Scouts of America therefore recognizes the religious element in this training of the boy, but it is absolutely nonsectarian in its attitude toward that or religious training. Its policitis that the home and the organization or institution with which the Scout is coresected shall give definite aftention to his reliious life.

Only persons willing to subscribe to this declarence gious life

tion of principle shall be entitled to certificates of leadership in carrying out the Scout program. Article II. Section 2.
