

Poncin receives probation, jail

Gary Poncin, 50, was sentenced to 10 years probation and six months at the county jail with one month of straight time and the remainder with a work release, by Judge Harvey Holtan in district court Monday.

In addition, Holtan required Poncin to pay a \$2,000 fine with a \$200 surcharge. Poncin must undergo a treatment program for sex offenders as well as any recommended aftercare or counseling.

Poncin pleaded guilty to a charge of criminal sexual conduct in the first degree. He had been charged with having sexual contact with a male juvenile over a period of about three years beginning in the fall of 1981 at Poncin's residence.

.. His first court appearance was Jan. 23. Poncin was released at that time on \$10,000 bail.

The charge carries a maximum penalty of 20 years in jail and a \$35,000 fine.

Conservatio sign-up end

By Jan. 1, 1990, all landowners farming highly erodible land need to have a conservation plan to reduce soil erosion and stay eligible for federal farm programs.

The Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) provides a way for those who farm highly erodible land to stay eligible and also maintain an income from such land.

Cropland next to streams, creeks, rivers and other water areas may qualify for the CRP, whether or not the land is highly erodible. These filter strip areas help keep agricultural runoff and sedi-
