## to set hearing for Goodman

Orange officials and Sgt. James Gowiman will face off for a second time as the suspended police officer appeals his case to the city's civil service commission.

According to state law, a civil service commission hearing must be conducted and a decision rendered within 30 days of Goodman's letter of appeal, filed Aug. 29. The commission is stated to meet at 4 p.m. Thursday at the Orange Police Department to set a hearing date.

Three commissioners preside on the board chaired by Dean Grant, Other commissioners are Art Adamson and the Rev. Clarence Breaux.

The hearing itself is a public meeting and will operate much like a regular court hearing, according to state law.

State law restricts the hearing to those four allegations Orange Police Chief Same Kiltrell filed against Goodman on Aug. 22, which include two allegations of homosexual misconduct with minors, taking delivery of a controlled substance and making alcohol available to minors.

Evidence may be presented however, to substantiate those allegations, according to Kittrell's attorney John Cash Smith.

"The charges submitted are the only ones you can prove, but you can bring in any evidence you want to substantiate those charges," Smith said.

State law allows that the commissioners may deliberate in private, however.

Smith said the commission's last contested case, in which he presided, was against Goodman in 1977 and he expects this one to be similar in style.

"They held it at night in a courtreom over at the courty courthouse and it was full (of on-lookers)," he said. "I presume they'll do the same thing this time."

And Cash said that since Goodman has called the hearing only two things could prevent it from taking place: a mutally agreed postponement or a grand jury indictment against Goodman.

The Orange County Attorney's Office has been investigating Goodman for several months but no criminal charges have been filed.

problems," Cash said. "Then his lawyer would be faced with putting him on the witness stand under oath and that testimony could be used against him in any later criminal proceedings.

"The lawyer would have a real question as to whether he wanted him on the stand," Cash said. "He could opt to not put him on the stand and plead the Fifth Amendment like in a criminal case... In a criminal case the deliberating body can't use that against him, they can't consider the fact that he wouldn't testify, but not so in a civil case. You can

scream and holler about the fact that he won't get on the stand and use it against him in a civil case

The commissioners are required by law to decide whether Goodman should be permanently dismissed from the department, temporarily suspended or restored to his position.

If Goodman is reinstated he is entitled to full compensation for the actual time and benefits lost during his suspension.

If the commission elects to suspend or dismiss him, Goodman may appeal the case again to a district court.

Orange Police Sgt. James Goodman last week not only denied the allegations of misconduct that the city has filed against him, but refuted the legality of the letter in which those allegations were made.

Outside officials, however, said they believe Goodman may have waived his right to appeal the case by filling an: improper letter himself.

Goodman, a 14-year-veteran of the Orange Police Department, was indefinitely suspended Aug. 17 on four administrative charges of violating civil service rules.

In a letter dated Aug. 22, Orange Police Cluef Sam Kit-. trell accused Goodman of two incidents of homosexual misconduct with minors, taking delivery of controlled substances and making alcohol available to minors.

Goodman replied last week with a three-page appeal letter that stated he not only denied the charges, but categorized why each charge was invalid. He also requested his immediate re-instatement based on the city's non-compliance with the law.

according to state law, the city is required to "file a ten statement with the commission giving the reasons for the suspension" within 120 hours of the original notifications. Within that letter, the department. head must "point out each civil service rule alleged to have been violated by the suspended fire fighter or police officer and must decribe the alleged acts of the person . . . It is not sufficient for the department head inerely to refer to the provisions of the rules alledged to have been violated," according to state law.

Goodman has alleged that the city failed to comply with this statute because Kittrell's order of suspension "does not describe the acts factually or specifically, and does not allege the name or identity of the persons" involved. He concluded in his appeal that, according to state law, he should be re-instated for their failure.

But Ron DeLord, president of the Combined Law Enforcement Associations of Texas, a statewide police lobby group based in Austin, said he disagrees with

- list of the rule violations they (Goodinan) are being charged with and then a statement of fact, a summary enough to give notice of the incident, and notice of his right to appeal, DeLord said. "That's about all they have to have in the letter." ..

DeLord said case law has shown that specific information is not required, especially when the incident involves minors whose identity is protected under law.

"It's not like an indictment where the charges have to be the same as the material presented to the hoard," he added.

John Cash Smith, the attorney appointed by the city to represent Kittrell in the appeal hearing, said the city omitted the names of the juveniles involved in the allegations because it "is trying very hard to protect" them.

Cash added that the city provided Goodman's lawyer, Louis Dugas, with depositions and affidavits from witnesses to the incidents.

"We weren't required to do that, but we did that to be sure we gave them enough information to know specifically what incidents we were referring to but then again to protect these kids from getting smeared all over the media," he said, "They have more than enough information to know what we are referring to."

A lawsuit aginst the city of Houston substantiated that the civil service charges aginst an officer that involved juveniles "did not need to meet the precision or technicality of a criminal indictment."

Goodman has also alleged that the city failed to make other material points clear including alleging a culpable mental state, the exact location and ownership of his home and the exact Texas Penal Code violations in question, items which are also required for a criminal procedure.

Smith, who is a long-time civil lawyer and served as a commissioner on an appeal hearing Goodman had over an unrelated incident in 1977, said the information Goodman is requesting is not required in a civil procedure.

"The burden of proof required in a rivil case is not nearly to the extent of a criminal case." Smith said. "All

the civil service commission has to be convinced is that these incidents more than likely happened - it's a civil burden not a criminal burden."

Several Texas lawsuits have established that civil service commissions need not meet criminal case requirements, including one against Fort Worth's civil service commission and one aginst Houston's commission.

Dugas declined to comment on why the information was requested.

"That stuff about the chief (omitting information) - that's just an argument and I don't think it will hold its water," DeLord said. "I think (the civil service commission) will just deny (his appeal) and then he can use it for the basis for a district court lawsuit, which isn't a bad legal move."

If the civil service commission does deny Goodman's appeal, he can appeal it to a district court, according to state law. :,

And while Goodman has cited deffciencies in Kiltrell's suspension order against him, DeLord said Goodman may have nullified his right to appeal by omitting information of his own.

In his letter to the Orange Civil Service Commission, Goodman states that he denies the truth of each allegation but never explicitly requests a hearing.

Delard said that Goodman's letter is required to include two statements: one denying the charges, their validity or the jurisdictional right of the commission, and another statement requesting a hearing either before the local commission or a third-party mediator.

"You can't just say 'I appeal because your letter is insufficient,' ' Dellord said. "If they don't request a hearing then the civil service commission cannot hear the case because they do not have any jurisdiction.

Dugas declined to comment on whether the letter meets the request requirements.

The requirements, DeLord said, were established by a case against the city of Plano, which CLEAT attorneys lost in 1985.

"If he didn't do it then it makes no difference what (the city's) letter states because he didn't properly appeal his case," DeLord added.

ORANGE — A police officer suspended after allegations of sexual assault, providing alcohorto minors and receiving illegal drugs resigned Friday, city offi-cials reported.

Police Chief Sam Kittrell suspended Sgt. James Goodman on Aug. 18, listing grounds for the suspension as "acts showing lack of good moral character" and "conduct prejudicial to good order."

City Manager Michael Van Wickler said he accepted Goodman's "voluntary resignation" about 2 p.m. in the office of attorney John Cash Smith, who ; has been hired to represent Kittrell in any proceeding involving Goodman.

Van Wickler said Goodman did not disclose the reason for his resignation.

"Sgt. Goodman's guilt or innocence of the charges brought against him by Chief Kittrell are being neither sustained or denied by my acceptance of his resignation," Van Wickler said.

Kittrell said Friday he could not comment. Goodman's attorney Louis Dugas Jr. also declined to comment.

Goodman, 40, has denied the accusations against him. He had appealed his suspension, but his resignation ends the appeal proc-

## Former Orange officer indicted

Former Orange Police Sgt. James Goodman was indicted Friday on two separate charges of indecency with a child.

According to indictments handed down by a grand jury held over from last month, Goodman, 40, engaged in sexual relations with two 17-year-old boys on different occasions.

Judge Buddie Hahn, 260th District Court, set bond at \$20,000 on each charge. Goodman was booked and released from the Orange County Jail Friday afternoon:

Neither Goodman nor his attorney, Louis Dugas, could be reached for comment Friday evening.

Goodman resigned from the Orange Police Department last Friday, ending his appeal of an indefinite suspension. A Civil Service Commission hearing was scheduled for later this month, but Goodman's resignation canceled it.

He was placed on indefinite suspension Aug. 17 after investigations revealed alleged homosexual activities with minors and taking delivery of illegal drugs, according to a letter filed with the commission.

The letter, filed by Orange Police Chief Sam Kittrell, also charged Goodman with making alcoholic beverages available to minors in his home. The violations reportedly dated back to November 1987.

County Attorney Steve Howard said the grand jury did not hear any other pleadings and declined further comments.

After he was suspended; Goodman filed an appeal letter denying the allegations of homosexual activities with minors and drug use. He also claimed that the notification of suspension did not comply with state law.

But the appeal was voided when Goodman resigned from the police department.

- (8) conduct prejudicial to good order;

You are charged with acts showing lack of good moral character and conduct prejudicial to good order as follows:

<sup>1.</sup> On or about Nov. 21, 1987, you engaged in an illegal sexual assault at home with a male under the age of 17, which is a violation of Section 22.011 of the penal code;

- 2. In late 1988, and in the first four months of 1989, you engaged in an illegal sexual assault at home with another male under the age of 17, a violation of Section 22.011 of the penal code.
- 3. At your home during 1988 and 1989, you knowingly made alcoholic beverages available to minors who consumed those beverages at your home, which is a violation of V.T.C.A. Alcoholic Beverage Code, Section 106.00.
- 4. On three occasions in the year 1989, you took delivery at your home of an illegal substance, or drug, which is a violation of The Controlled Substance Act, Art. 4476-15, Section 4.041.

A copy of this statement has been filed with the Firefighters and Police Officers Civil Service Commission of the City
of Orange, and you may appeal this indefinite suspension in writing
to said commission within ten (10) days after receiving a copy of
this statement, or if you choose, you may, within the same time
period, elect to appeal to an independent third-party hearing
examiner instead of to the Commission. If you elect to appeal to
a hearing examiner, you will waive all rights of appeal to a
district court except for certain limited circumstances as detailed
in subsection (j) of Section 143.057 of the Local Government Code.

The above actions are related to criminal activity and render you unfit for further service in the Orange Police Department. All of the above acts have been

discovered within 180 days of the date of your suspension on August 18, 1989.

## APPLICANT PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING REVIEW OF DECISION DENYING REGISTRATION

- 1. If registration is refused, the applicant may request a review of this decision. This request must be in the form of a written request from the individual which includes his or her version of the facts supporting the claim that registration should not have been denied.
- 2. Upon receipt of the written request for review, the president of the local council shall appoint a committee to review the situation.
- 3. The appointed committee should review the facts as presented, and, in addition, may interview any persons whose testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
- 4. A confidential report will be given to the applicant setting forth the decision of the committee.
- 5. The applicant may—if he or she does not agree with the decision—request a review from the regional director by submitting a written request for such a review within 30 days of the receipt of the local council decision.
- 6. If the regional review does not satisfy the applicant, he or she may ask for further review by the National Council by submitting a written request for such a review within 30 days of the receipt of the regional decision. The decision by the National Council is final.
