Former scoutmaster pleads guilty to child molestation

BARSTOW — A former Morongo Basin scoutmaster and volunteer firefighter pleaded guilty Tuesday to 18 counts of felony child molestation on the eve of his jury trial.

Seventeen other felony counts against James Buxton, 43, of Twentynine Palms will be dismissed as part of a plea bargain.

Buxton, who helped organize Wonder Valley's Boy Scout Troop 341 in November 1987, was accused of committing 32 lewd acts with children and three acts of sodomy at Scout camps and other locations between February and November 1988, said deputy district attorney Linda Root. Fourteen of the victims were boys 13 and under, she said, and one was a girl, 8.

Under the plea agreement, Buxton faces a maximum sentence of 42 years in state prison.

Superior Court Judge Rufus Vent will sentence Buxton on March 23, courtroom clerk Debbie Lentine said. The defendant

was returned to the county jail in San Bernardino, without bail.

Buxton's court-appointed attorney, Grover Porter of San Bernardino, said 14 other felony counts of lewd acts on children and three counts of sodomy, also felonies, will be dismissed March 23 as part of the plea agreement.

"Mr. Buxton is satisfied with the agreement," Porter said Tuesday. "He didn't want to put the children through the agony of a trial.

"He is remorseful and knows what occurred was wrong. He's willing to accept his responsibility for his actions and is ready to move on."

Root called the agreement fair and said it imposes "a substantial penalty" on the defendant, who must serve at least 21 years in prison before he is eligible for parole.

"You can never balance what happened to the children, but it was important to get this incident behind them," she said.

The prosecutor said the children and their parents had been

The plea at 1:40 p.m. came in the second day of jury selection for a trial that Root said could have lasted four to six weeks.

Out of a panel of 85 potential jurors, Yent dismissed 60 percent as they felt they could not be fair because of the nature of the charges, Porter said.

Robert said he now expected the Senate to approve the bill Thursday but only with the understanding it would then be moved to a joint Assembly-Senate conference committee.

Deukmejian, who has said he supports moving up the presidential primary, "has always assumed" the Legislature was considering separate state and presidential primaries, spokesman Tom Beerbaum said.

Jury selection starts in Barstow molestation case

BARSTOW — Jury selection begins today in the trial of a former Morongo Basin scoutmaster and volunteer firefighter accused of 35 counts of felony child molestation.

The Superior Court trial of James Buxton, 43, of Twentynine Palms, who faces up to 280 years in state prison if convicted on all counts, is expected to last four to six weeks, deputy district attorney Linda Root said.

Buxton, who helped organize Wonder Valley's Boy Scout Troop 341 in November 1987, is accused of committing 32 lewd acts with children and three acts of sodomy on Scout camp-outs between February and November 1988, Root said.

Grover Porter of San Bernardino, the court-appointed defense attorney, predicted Wednesday that jury selection would be difficult in the wake of the nearly three-year Mc-

Martin Pre-School molestation trial in Los Angeles.

"I hope we can find 12 people who are willing to be open-minded and who will weigh the evidence fairly," Porter said.

"It's a very complicated case — like walking in a mine field after the McMartin case — as parents are very upset," the defense lawyer said.

Two McMartin defendants were found innocent after the lengthy trial, but defendant Ray Buckley faces a new trial on 13 other counts of molestation.

"I'm concerned with the lack of physical evidence to support some of the allegations," Porter said. "You want some certainty before you deprive a person of their freedom."

Prosecutor Root said she plans to call about 30 witnesses, including many of the children and their parents. Fourteen of the alleged victims were boys 13 years old and younger at the time of the incidents, she said, and one was an 8-year-old girl.

Porter said he is unsure about the number of witnesses he will call, but he expects the trial to last three to four weeks.

"I'll be cross-examining the kids," he said. "There are questions I want to ask them about certain counts. You can have all those counts, some which may be true and some that may not be true. Evidence will determine which are true or untrue."

The trial will be before Judge Rufus Yent.

Buxton, a former shuttle bus driver at Los Angeles International Airport, moved to the Morongo Basin with friends in 1987

and became a volunteer firefighter with the California Department of Forestry and Fire's Wonder Valley station.

"He was instrumental in founding the Scout troop, which was sponsored by the CDF unit and initially held meetings at the fire station," Root said.

The parents of some of the Scouts were fellow volunteer firefighters of Buxton's.

Buxton was arrested by sheriff's deputies Nov. 9, 1988, after two mothers of alleged victims of sex acts made separate statements to deputies. Root said the women had learned there might be incidents of child molestation at camp-outs and questioned their children before asking deputies to investigate.

Defense attorney Porter said he did not want to comment on specific allegations.

After a preliminary hearing

last April and another in June in Morongo Basin Municipal Court, Buxton was bound over for trial in Barstow. Root said the second pre-trial hearing was held to receive testimony from alleged victims who came forward after the earlier hearing.

Buxton is in custody in the county jail in San Bernardino with bail set at \$100,000.

He is the second Wonder Valley firefighter and Scouting official to face charges in connection with alleged lewd acts involving Scouts in the valley.

Root said retired Marine David Reed, 42, a volunteer firefighter who served as coordinator for Troop 341, was sentenced to 38 years in state prison last year after pleading guilty to 16 felony counts of child molestation.

Reed entered the plea after reaching an agreement with the prosecution that his prison term would be limited to 38 years, Root said.

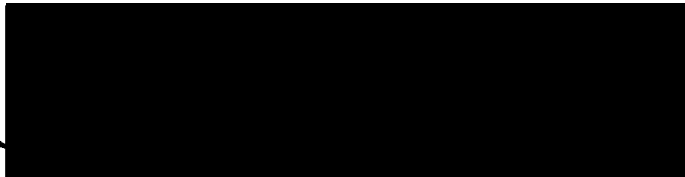

They endorsed the checks and it was credited to their personal accounts at the jail.

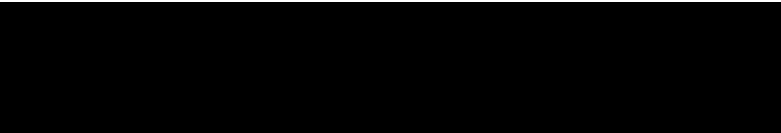
David Reed and James Buxton requested that Detective Van Der Wyk take the letters and place them in the bag with their personal belongings, which are stored outside the jail.

2 men held for lewd acts

WONDER VALLEY — An investigation into reports of sexual acts committed against two 11-year-old boys during a camping trip has led to the filing of charges against two Morongo Basin men, a spokesman for the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department said Tuesday.

A complaint filed Monday by the District Attorney's office charges James Buckston, 42, of Twentynine Palms, with six counts of lewd and lascivious acts against a child and David Allen Reed, 46, of Wonder Valley, with four counts of the same crime, said Sheriff's Department Public Affairs Officer Jim Bryant.

The two were arrested Nov. 10 at Reed's residence at 4150 Gammel Road for investigation into the matter, said Bryant.

Both men are in custody in the Central County Jail in San Bernardino. Bail for Reed was set at \$100,000 while Buckston is being held on \$7,000 bail.

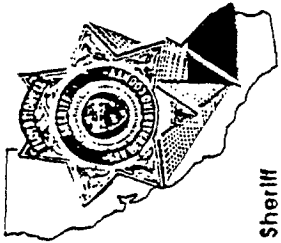

On the evening of November 7, 1988, I received a telephone call from [REDACTED], whose son is a Boy Scout registered in Troop 341 in the community of Wonder Valley, Joshua Monument District. [REDACTED] told me that her son, [REDACTED] had just told her of an incident which occurred during a troop campout. [REDACTED] told me that she was told by her son that on, or about, September 25, 1988, the troop was at a camp ground which they referred to as Firestone. On one evening of the campout [REDACTED] had reason to be in Scoutmaster Buxton's tent. Buxton unzipped the boys pants, grasped the boy's penis and put it in his mouth. The boy said that he slapped the man. [REDACTED] assures me that this is a true statement to the best of her belief and knowledge.

She also told me that there may be similar incidents between Buxton and other Scouts.

This fact situation was given to Gary Jensen and John Dudley on the evening of November 7, 1988, by telephone.

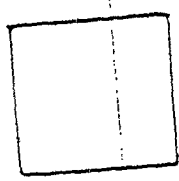
