Dear Mr. Park:

I have received your letter dated June 4, 1991 responding to my request to be allowed to register in Scouting. I must say that I am disappointed in being denied the opportunity.

I do not question the right of the Boy Scouts to deny membership to anyone. I was in Scouting for more than twenty years and enjoyed the program very much. I am most disappointed to learn that after ten years (since being denied membership), after a successful civil suit against my accuser, after a dismissal of charges following a complete investigation, that the Scouting organization still will not allow me to register.

What is most puzzling to me is that I was allowed no input, no opportunity to express myself. I can only conclude that a review consisted of reading the same dossier that is just as inaccurate today as it was ten years ago.

Even a convicted felon at least has a point at which the sentence is completed and justice is served.

I still strongly deny my guilt, so I am not asking for forgiveness. I do realize that at age 35 (when the accusations were made) I was idealistic rather than pragmatic and that some lapses in good judgement put me in the position where these false charges could be made. I just never believed the organization would not believe me or at least consider the evidence before passing judgement.

Please add this to my dossier.



Former Scouts leader indicted in sex abuse

A former Lancaster Boy Scouts leader was indicted Monday on charges of sexually abusing a teenage member of his troop at the leader's home and on scouting trips in 1979.

Charged was Joe Dan Denison, 35, of 3615 Ames Road.

Denison, a telephone company employe who works in North Dallas, was arrested and arraigned shortly after noon Monday. He was released from Dallas County Jail Monday night on \$7,500 bond.

The former Scouts leader is accused of having molested 12 of 13 times with a 14-year-old member of Boy

Scouts Troop 524 in Lancaster, police said.

Six of those incidents allegedly occurred at Denison's house during April, May and June 1979; other sexual encounters took place on Boy Scouts outings to New Mexico and Austin, police said.

Lancaster Police Sgt. R.D. Campbell said the boy's mother approached Lancaster police in January and asked for an investigation in Denison's conduct.

But Kenneth Kahler, an assistant leader of Troop 524, said Monday he

Boy Scouts officials said they do not know how long Denison was part of their organization. He was a Scouts leader of his own group before it merged with Troop 524 about three years ago, they said.
Kahler said Denison was assistant Scouts leader in Troop 524 for four or five months in late 1978 and early 1979. After that, Denison stayed active with the Scouts and even sat on the court of honor that awarded the Scouts' Gamble award in May 1979.

Charged was Joe D. Denison, 36, of 3615 Amer Road.

Denison, a telephone company employee who works in North Dallas, was arrested at a motel near the airport north of town Monday. He was released from Dallas County Jail Monday night on a \$500 bond.

The former Scouts leader is accused of having oral sex with a 14-year-old member of Boy Scouts Troop 524 in Leander, police said.

Some of those incidents allegedly occurred at Denison's house during April, May and June 1979, other sexual encounters took place on Boy Scouts outings to New Mexico and Austin, police said.

Leander Police Sgt. B.D. Campbell said the boy Scout leader was charged with sexual abuse of a minor and possession of child pornography. Campbell and other police are investigating the incident.

But Kenneth Kable, Leander Scout leader for Troop 524, said Monday he had heard about the allegations.

Jury indicts ex-scout leader

The Dallas County grand jury indicted a 35-year-old former Boy Scout leader Monday on charges of sexual abuse of a child.

Named in the indictment was Joe Dan Denison of Lancaster.

Lancaster police Sgt. R.D. Campbell arrested Denison at the Southwestern Bell Telephone office, 5525 LBJ Freeway, Monday afternoon. He was arraigned before Justice of the Peace Robert Cole, who set bond at \$7,500. Denison was released from Dallas City Jail Monday night.

The felony indictment stems from a 14-year-old boy's accusation that Denison repeatedly engaged in homosexual acts

with him during overnight stays at Denison's home.

The boy, a member of Denison's Boy Scout troop, told Lancaster police he had grown close to Denison after his father's death several years ago. He said he ended their 3-year relationship in July 1980, but he did not reveal the sexual incidents until late last year.

Since the boy's allegations came to light, Denison has been suspended from participating in scouting activities by executives of the Circle 10 Boy Scout Council of Dallas.

If found guilty of the third-degree felony charge against him, Denison would face a maximum penalty of 10 years in prison.

Scout officials and Denison could not be reached for comment Monday night.

Statements given to Lancaster police show the boy joined Denison's scout troop and began spending the night with him when he was 11.

The statements also say Denison has been named in the Boy Scouts of America's national database of sex offenders. On two scout trips — to New Mexico in July 1979 and Arizona in February 1980 — Denison was accused of homosexual acts, according to the statements.

The boy revealed the incidents during questioning by his head scoutmaster and an assistant scoutmaster about marijuana smoking during summer camp last year.

In August, 1980, District Executive Terry Lawson came to me with a report from an adult leader in Troop #524 that Assistant Scoutmaster Joe Dan Denison had been accused by Scout [REDACTED] of a homosexual involvement with him.

Within two weeks, I met, at my request, with the adult leaders, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], who related the accusations by Scout [REDACTED] saying that Joe Dan Denison had on a number of occasions performed on him oral sex action. [REDACTED] also told them that Mr. Denison kept sex books at his home and showed them to other boys. I was told by Mr. [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED] that [REDACTED] volunteered to take a polygraph to prove he was telling the truth.

After consultation with Dave Parks, attorney with the National Council, Boy Scouts of America, and Robert F. Ritchie, attorney for Circle Ten Council, I informed the Circle Ten Council registration department that when Mr. Denison tried to reregister in Scouting to tell him to see me.

Approximately late August or early September, Mr. Denison attempted to register as a Scoutmaster of another troop. The registration department of Circle Ten Council informed him that he would have to see me before he could register.

I met with Mr. Denison and informed him of the allegations by [REDACTED] and the fact that [REDACTED] was willing to take a polygraph. Mr.

Denison denied the charges by [REDACTED]

I explained to Mr. Denison that membership in the Boy Scouts of America was a privilege and not a right and that this matter would have to be resolved before he could reregister in Scouting.

I suggested that he might want to consider a meeting with [REDACTED] and his mother.

I asked Mr. Denison if he also would be willing to submit to a polygraph. His answer was, "Yes." I told him that the Circle Ten Council would pay for the polygraph. I explained to Mr. Denison the allegations being made against him would be kept confidential.

During the months from September through December, Mr. Denison called me on several occasions asking if I would be willing to meet with him as he confronted [REDACTED] and his mother. After consulting with the Circle Ten Council attorney, Robert Ritchie, I told Joe I would meet with him and the [REDACTED].

On November 5, 1980, I received a letter (Exhibit A) from Mr. Denison's attorney stating that he did not want a confrontation with the [REDACTED].

On November 26, 1980, Jim Kaminski, Director of Field Service; and Terry Lawson, District Executive, met with [REDACTED] and his mother at their home and were given details of the alleged sex acts performed on [REDACTED] by Mr. Denison.

which said that he and his attorney felt that he should not subscribe to the polygraph.

On December 22, 1980, a polygraph examination was administered to [REDACTED] by Don E. McElroy and Associates (Exhibit C).

On January 2, 1981, I called Mr. Denison to inform him that [REDACTED] had taken the polygraph and that in the examiner's opinion that [REDACTED] was non-deceptive.

I explained to Mr. Denison that until the matter was resolved in his favor, he was being denied membership in the Boy Scouts of America and was not to serve in any registered or unregistered capacity with any Scout unit or activity.

Joe Denison called Billy Gamble to say that he had scheduled a meeting for February 10 in Lancaster with the troop committee of the troop with which he is currently associated. He stated the purpose of the meeting was to tell the committee of the allegation being made against him by the [REDACTED] and that he was being denied membership in Scouting, including any association official or unofficial. Mr. Denison asked me to be present. After consulting with the Circle Ten Council attorney, Robert Ritchie, I told Mr. Denison that I would be present at the February 10 meeting.

Mr. Denison explained the charges that had been made against him by the [REDACTED] and that the council was denying him membership in Scouting. It became obvious that Mr. Denison had already informed them of the charges before the meeting, and only pretended to be informing them at this time.

This was confirmed later in the meeting.

The committee appeared to be convinced of Mr. Denison's innocence of the charges and proceeded to try to convince Circle Ten Council to allow him to continue in at least an unofficial capacity. I restated the policy of the Boy Scouts of America regarding adult membership standards of the Boy Scouts of America and told them their troop charter would be "pulled" if they refused to comply with the policy of the Boy Scouts of America.

The three committee members and Mr. Denison understand Scouting's position in this matter and are to select a new leader.



Mr. Denison would prefer to work this out in a professional manner and among as few people as possible. This would minimize the potential damage to Mr. Denison's excellent reputation and would also minimize the liability of the [REDACTED] and the Boy Scouts for repeating unfounded charges about Mr. Denison.

All Mr. Denison wants is to be allowed to continue in Scouting. This is a very important part of his life that he does not want to give up. Mr. Denison does not desire any further contact with the [REDACTED]. It should be a simple matter to arrange for Mr. Denison to participate with a Scout Troop other than the one to which [REDACTED] belongs.

Please let me know if I can be of any assistance to you in resolving this matter. Hopefully this can be done quickly and without the need for protracted litigation.

Not once - Not ONCE has this kind of allegation been made against me. With all those opportunities, does it seem reasonable that after hundreds of other opportunities suddenly I would ~~to~~ develop into a child molester? Just because one child with a reputation for drug abuse, with a history of emotional instability, with a reputation for blaming others for his own problems - just because he makes this ridiculous accusation does not make it true.

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Now I am angry. As per your request on December 22, 1980 a polygraph examination was administered to [REDACTED] at my office in Irving, Texas. The purpose of the examination was to verify the fact that he was truthful in certain allegations of sexual abuse against a Joe Dan Dennison.

Mr. [REDACTED] is a caucasian male, age 15, born 4/21/65 in Dallas, Texas. He is in the 10th grade at Skyline High School and he denies any arrests in his background.

CASE DETAILS:

You advised prior to the examination that sometime between January 1979 through August 1979 that [REDACTED] had made certain allegations of sexual abuse by Joe Dan Dennison, an adult. You advised that [REDACTED] alleges that Joe Dan Dennison did use his mouth on [REDACTED] penis and this occurred numerous times between January and August 1979.

PRE-TEST INTERVIEW:

During the pre-test interview [REDACTED] stated he had been in scouts about 4 years and his first contact with Joe Dan Dennison was when he was asked to stay at his house in Lancaster, Texas. He said he spent the night with him, that he was sleeping and he can remember Dennison getting close to him in the bed and he touched around on him. He said Joe Dennison then put his mouth on his penis and [REDACTED] stated he reached a climax at that time. He states this occurred off and on for approximately 15 times o

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more from January 1979 through August 1979. He can remember specifically at Camp Philmoung where he was assigned to Dennison's tent. He said he can remember 2 or 3 times during that campout, the man doing the same thing to him and he would reach a climax and the man would swallow it. When questioned further, he said he was scared and didn't know what to do. He was scared to resist and didn't know how to handle it, until it came out in a discussion with a couple of friends of his and there was some indication Dennison had had some problems with his other friends and that was when it came to light.

TEST ADMINISTRATION:

Following the pre-test interview a test was structured and administered to [REDACTED]. Following is a list of the pertinent issue test questions and noted are his responses.


1. Concerning the questions I will be asking you about Joe Dennison, do you intend to answer them with the truth?
A: Yes.
2. Are you truthful when you say between January 1979 and August 1979, Joe Dan Dennison put his mouth on your penis several times?
A: Yes.
3. Did you encourage Joe Dennison into having oral sex with you at any time?
A: No.
4. Between January 1979 and August 1979 on campouts, did Joe Dennison put his mouth on your penis like you say?
A: Yes.
5. Were you truthful when you said you were scared to say anything about Joe Dennison to anyone at the time?
A: Yes.

TEST RESULTS:

Evaluation of [REDACTED] polygrams revealed criteria indicating no deceptive responding to relevant issue test questions. It is the examiner's opinion, based on responses that did appear, that he was non-deceptive.
