

Suspended doctor given conditional reinstatement

WINONA — Dr. Joseph Peter Repice said this morning he was 'pleased' with his conditional reinstatement to the staff at Winona Clinic.

Repice, 45, faces four felonly charges of fourth-degree sexual conduct in Winona District Court.

He was orginally charged March 9 and will next appear in court April 4.

On March 9, the clinic board of directors decided to suspend Repice from his practice until the charges were resolved. That decision was reversed in a Wednesday night vote by the clinic shareholders.

Repice, who has not practiced since March 9, said he has agreed to return to work Monday under the conditions stipulated by share-holders: that he see only patients who request to see him; that he will not prescribe controlled substances; and that he be chaperoned during all patient contacts.

Asked if he wants to continue with his practice at Winona Clinic, Repice answered, "Absolutely."

Clinic Administrator Jerry Kneusel said the facility's 24 doctors — not all shareholders — met Wednesday night to discuss several options on Repice's association with the clinic. Repice attended the meeting.

In a vote, Kneusel said a majority endorsed the conditional reinstatement.

A Winona pediatrician has been charged with four counts of criminal sexual conduct involving a 17-year-old boy who was a patient.

The complaint against Dr. Joseph Peter Repice, 44, alleges that he fondled the boy on a visit to the boy's home in October and that he told the boy that masturbation would help alleviate his severe headaches.

Specifically, Repice, who had been an assistant Boy Scout troop leader until

resigning last month, is charged with using his position of authority over the boy to have sexual contact with him, and falsely telling him that the sexual contact was for a medical purpose. The alleged victim is now 18.

The complaint against Repice also states that he gave the youth addictive morphine-like drugs for headaches, even after the boy had been treated for an overdose at the Mayo Clinic and had been told by a Mayo physician to avoid narcotics.

The boy's mother told investigators that her son took one of the drugs, Percodan, "like candy."

Special assistant Attorney General William Klumpp, who is prosecuting the case, said there was no physical evidence with which to charge Repice with drug violations.

Repice, who was the subject of disciplinary action for his own drug use in 1986 by the Minnesota Board of Medical Examiners, was suspended Friday from his practice by the Winona Clinic.

Repice made an initial appearance in Winona County District Court yesterday. He was released on the condition that he have no contact with the alleged victim.

The Complainant, being duly sworn, makes complaint to the above-named Court and states that there is probable cause to believe that the Defendant committed the following offense(s). The complainant states that the following facts establish PROBABLE CAUSE:

Your Complainant is Investigator Phillip Gaddis of the Winona Police Department. Your complainant's department has investigated a complaint of criminal sexual conduct filed against DR. JOSEPH PETER REPICE, a/k/a DR. JOE, who is a Winona pediatrician. The information contained in this affidavit was obtained by interviews conducted by your affiant, the review of reports prepared by other law enforcement officers, and the review of medical records.

met with officers from the Winona Police Department for the first time concerning this matter on December 11, 1989. The is the mother of d.o.b. d.o.b. a year old boy. was released from chemical dependency She reported that treatment for drud and alcohol abuse in late March or early April, 1989. After returning to her home, _____ had complained about headaches and had gone to the Winona Community Hospital emergency room on many occasions. DR. REPICE initially treated complaints by giving him injections of Demerol. According to the 1990 Physicians Desk Reference, Demerol is a narcotic analgesic with multiple actions qualitatively similar to those of morphine. The PDR indicates that the principal actions of therapeutic value are analgesia and station. A warning in the PDR indicates that Demerol can produce drug dependence of the morphine type. When expressed her reservations to DR. REPICE about the use of Demerol, he told her it would not hurt

indicated that her son and DR. REPICE had a relationship which seemed strange to her. She said that her son would call REPICE at the doctor's home when he had a headache and that the doctor would come to her apartment carrying a small brown bag. The doctor would then go into room and give The doctor would remain in the room for several hours with the FILED

door locked according to She indicated that she had also taken her son to the hospital in the past where he was seen by DR. REPICE. At the hospital DR. REPICE told to go home because he would bring her son home later.

also reported that her son had gone to the hospital several times alone and had received treatment from DR. REPICE without her permission or signature. It did not believe that was correct because her son was only years old. Your complainant has reviewed hospital records which indicated that DR. REPICE did treat without parental permission.

Records obtained by your complainant from the Winona Community Hospital indicate that Dr. DeNardis saw on July 6, 1989, for right shoulder pain. A notation in the records indicated, "No pain killer. Was an abuser." The hospital records reveal that DR. REPICE prescribed Demerol to on September 30, October 1, October 2, October 4, October 9, and October 10, 1989. Records obtained from the Winona Clinic indicate that DR. REPICE administered Demerol to on October 10, October 11, and October 12, 1989.

When your affiant reviewed hospital emergency room records, it did not appear that there was any authorization for the treatment of on October 9, October 10, and October 22 (two visits). The torm dated October 22 notes "states to me that he's emancipated." However, on December 11, 1989, was contacted by DR. REPICE who told her that her son was in the emergency room because of an overdose and that he needed her permission to treat him. She also stated that DR. REPICE told her that her son had overdosed by taking 15 Elavil tablets.

stated REPICE had picked her son up at his home and taken him for long drives. Her son would not return home until late in the night or early in the morning.

The picked had asked her son to go out of town with him and would inform her son when the doctor would be out of town.

took her son to Rochester to be checked because of the complaints of headaches. Her son was admitted to a hospital in Rochester on October 13 and was discharged on October 15, 1989.

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REPICE brought her son home from the hospital. that after bringing her son home from Rochester DR. REPICE gave him another shot of Demerol. turned over to the Winona Police Department an October 24, 1989 letter from Dr. William E. Karnes of the Mayo Clinic to DR. JOSEPH REPICE. The letter indicated that the Mayo Clinic had "strongly urged him [to avoid narcotics in managing his headaches" and suggested other medications to use. Dr. Karnes also noted that he "shared your IDR. REPICE's] liking for" also indicated that DR. REPICE gave her son a prescription for Percodan, which her son took like candy. When she mentioned this to DR. REPICE, the doctor told her not to worry. Physicians Desk Reference indicates that Percodan contains a principal ingredient of oxycodone which is a semisynthetic narcotic analgesic with multiple actions qualitatively similar to those of morphine. The warning in the PDR indicates that Percodan can produce drug dependency of the morphine type and,

indicated that there was one weekend in October when DR. REPICE said he'd put in a lot of hours at the hospital and clinic causing him to become very tired. He said he would not be able to come out if the needed him and requested that stay at his house for the weekend. DR. REPICE also told her that his wife was out of town for the weekend. However, did not spend the weekend with REPICE.

therefore, has the potential for being abused.

On October 17. 1989, called his mother and asked her to go to a local pharmacy to pick up a prescription for his headache. She told her son it would take her a while to get there but that she would pick up the prescription. While she was at the pharmacy picking up the prescription for Percodan, DR. REPICE came in and seemed surprised to see her. He told her that he had come over to pick up her son's prescription and take it to him. told the doctor that was why she was there. REPICE left.

On October 19, 1989, DR. REPICE's day off, he came over and wanted to go with him to the YMCA. told DR. REPICE that had taken up to ten of the Percodan tablets and that she was concerned about him. DR. REPICE told her not to worry,

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was tine, and that she had no reason to be concerned. She indicated that her son seemed to be under the influence of the medication but that he left with DR. REPICE. He was gone for two to three hours.

When went to the hospital on December 11, 1989, DR. REPICE told her that he had removed himself from her son's case. doctor indicated that he needed to catheterize her son but that he couldn't stand to do it because it was so painful. Consequently, he turned the case over to another doctor. was released from the hospital on December 12, 1989. indicated that see 's girlfriend. had told her that had met with DR. REPICE down by the levy on the evening of December 12 after he had gotten out of the hospital.

Your complainant interviewed 's father on December 28, 1989. He told your aftiant that DR. REPICE called him after had dotten out of chemical dependency treatment. DR. REPICE told him that he wanted to counsel |

On December 29, 1989, called your complainant and stated that she had just talked with significant spiritriend. stated that told her that she had told that didn't talk to her and tell her the truth about what was going on with DR. REPICE (whom reterred to as DR. JOE). that she was not going to see him anymore. told that _____ started crying and didn't say anything for about ten minutes. He then told that DR. JOE had "beat him off" but a made promise not to tell anyone. The dasked why he continued to see DR. REPICE. Told that DR. JOE had helped him more than anyone else. night in October while was still having severe headaches he had come to her and told her that DR. REPICE had told him that he should try "beating off" to relieve his headaches. When asked her son why a doctor would talk to a young man like said that DR. JOE was just putting it in kid's that. terms.

On December 29 your complainant met with to tell me about the events leading up to the incident where overdosed. _____ stated that on December 10 she was talking with on the telephone when he told her he had to J.C. (JQC

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wanted to talk with him. said she called back later in the alternoon and asked what DR. REPICE had wanted. told her that DR. JOE wanted to know if he was taking his Elavil. told that he told DR. REPICE he hadn't taken any Elavil in a couple of days. The related that said DR. REPICE told him he needed to take fifteen of the Elavil tablets in order to get his level back up. The then asked what kind of doctor would tell him to take that many pills. Said that he was just kidding but that he did have to get his level back up. Said did seem to be in a good mood when she talked with him on both occasions that Sunday.

and could tell immediately that something was wrong because of his appearance. I related that she visited in the hospital on December 12 along with While was in room, DR. REPICE came in and told her that he needed to talk to and asked her to leave the room. After DR. REPICE lelt, she went back into the room, and could see that was crying even though he turned away from her. The times what was wrong before he finally turned to her, telling her that DR. REPICE wasn't going to be on his case any more. Told her that when they put the bag in for his kidneys DR. REPICE was too close to him and he couldn't do it.

she called him about 10 p.m. in the evening. told her he couldn't talk because DR. JOE was picking him up. The next day she asked where he and DR. REPICE had gone. told her that they had gone down to the levy, smoked some cigarettes, and talked about everything that was going on. said she was over at house on December 19 and went into his bedroom. She could tell immediately that he was on something. She asked what he was taking. He told her it was an antibiotic. She asked how many he had taken and he told her one. DR. REPICE had given them to him the night before.

On December 28 at about 11 a.m. was on the telephone talking to the told the subject of DR. REPICE came up.

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whole truth. wanted to know what she meant; told him that he just wasn't telling her everything. She then asked him if there wasn't more. This caused him to be quiet for a while and say, "Yes, there is more asked asked if she came over if he would tell her. said he would.

said that she then went over to shouse, arriving about 1 p.m. She said that was in bed asleep but that she woke him up and asked him to tell her the rest of it. said that was very hesitant and began defending DR. REPICE. Stold her that it could wreck DR. JOE's career if he told. He said he couldn't do that. It related that she told that if he wasn't going to tell her, she was going to leave. Sked her not to leave and to come back in, which she did.

he hadn't told anyone else. Said made her swear that she wouldn't tell anyone. She said was crying and said. "When f was getting those shots of Demerol, you know how I was supposed to masterbate? Well, one of those times, DR. JOE did it for me." said that as was "Well, DR. JOE did it for me." he was moving his hand up and down above his groin. Said she asked if he thought DR. JOE did it to help him or it he thought he was being sexually abused. Told her, "Right now I don't know it he was helping or sexually abusing me." Then told her, "I would rather die than let this out and wreck the man's career." Said she asked if there were any threats or if DR. JOE had told him not to tell anyone. Said was still crying and was afraid she would think he was "a faggot." Assured him that that was not the case but that he still continued to be very embarrassed. Knew that was scheduled to see a counselor in LaCrosse and made him promise to talk to the counselor about DR. REPICE.

nformed your complainant that on January 2, 1990, she was intormed in the presence of her son and that there had been "sexual abuse" between her son and DR. REPICE. Total told your complainant that she had told her son that he had to

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call to the doctor. said that DR. REPICE would give him a shot in his hip and that it would take effect in about 15 minutes. He said he would be totally knocked out after that period of time.

Your complainant then asked if DR. REPICE had given him some other instructions on relieving his headaches. Said that after DR. REPICE stopped giving him the Demerol on the recommendation of the Mayo Clinic, he was on Elavil but still having headaches. He said that one night DR. REPICE was over talking with him about the headaches. Said that DR. REPICE told him, "Try to beat off. It will relieve the pressure." Said he had not followed the doctor's instructions because it was his experience that when he became sexually excited by being around his girlfriend, his headaches would increase.

indicated that there were two occasions shortly before he was in the hospital in Rochester when DR. REPICE touched his penis. He said that he received back rubs preceding these incidents. Said that DR. REPICE would have him undress and then give him a back rub, butt rub, chest rub, and stomach rub. He said that on several occasions during the stomach rubs DR. REPICE touched his penis. Said that he thought at the time the touches were accidental but that now he is not so sure. said that the back rubs all occurred prior to a time when DR. REPICE masterbated him.

related that one evening after he had gotten out of the hospital in Rochester in the latter part of October he had experienced a severe headache and that his little sister had called DR. REPICE for him. Said that he was still taking Elavil and that he was lying on his stomach on the living room floor when DR. REPICE arrived. After DR. REPICE came in they went up to a bedroom where laid on the bed. Said that DR. REPICE sat down on the bed next to him and they talked for a while. Said that he was wearing cutoff jogging pants, like sweat pants, and that he couldn't remember if he was wearing a football jersey or any kind of a shirt.

said that he was lying on top of the bed covers talking to DR. REPICE when DR. REPICE reached over and reached inside of his pants from the top and started to rub seems such seems with his

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hand.. said that he was being masterbated by DR. REPICE. said that it didn't seem right but at the time he trusted DR. REPICE because he was the one trying to help him. said that it did not help the headache and in fact made it worse; consequently. pretended to fall asleep. said DR. REPICE stopped masterbating him before he climaxed and left. said he was talking to DR. REPICE a few days later when DR. REPICE said he felt badly about what had happened. DR. REPICE said he was just trying to help DR. REPICE to torget about it. REPICE said he couldn't just forget about it because he could be put in jail for it. DR. REPICE then asked to keep it just between them, promising never to do it again or bring it up again. When detailing the masterbation incident, described DR. REPICE's hand as moving in an up and down motion. "In response to a question from your complainant said it was hard to say how many times REPICE'S hand went up and down but he estimated around twenty. said that he did not get a back

indicated that one time before he went into the hospital in Rochester he was at his old dirl friend's. When he dot a bad headache. Said he called DR. REPICE who told him that his wife was in Boston but that his kids were home. DR. REPICE offered to let him spend the night at his house but declined.

rub from DR. REPICE on the occasion when he was masterbated.

also indicated that there were times when DR. REPICE would pick him up at home and take him to the emergency room where he received shots of Demerol. Said it was DR. REPICE who offered to pick him up at the hospital in Rochester when he was discharged. Said that on the way home he got a headache and that DR. REPICE did give him a shot of Demerol so that he could go to sleep.

also related an incident when he went over to the YMCA with DR. REPICE. He said that they went to the health club portion of the YMCA where they took a sauna and a whirlpool. said that neither he nor the doctor were swim suits while a they were in the sauna or the whirlpool.

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a men's only area and there were other men present, none of whom was wearing a swim suit. Said REPICE did not register him as a quest.

also related another incident where DR. REPICE called him on a Thursday after he had gotten out of the hospital in Rochester. This was DR. REPICE's day off. DR. REPICE asked if he wanted to go for a ride to Rochester to pick up some Boy Scout badges. A greed and was picked up by DR. REPICE between II a.m. and noon. Said there were no medications given during that trip.

also related that DR. REPICE had asked him about his sex life even during the time when he was still having stomach problems. DR. REPICE would ask about his girlfriend, and if he went all the way with his girlfriend. DR. REPICE told him to use condoms if he did. The said that DR. REPICE asked him about his sexuality. The said that DR. REPICE would ask him if he was a "quy kind of quy or a girl kind of quy." said he asked DR. REPICE if he (DR. REPICE) was crazy. The said DR. REPICE got quiet then. The told him that he was definitely a "girl kind of guy" and had never questioned that fact. DR. REPICE said that he was just wondering because it wasn't unusual for a kid to sage to question that.

On January 8, 1990, your complainant met with DR. REPICE. I told him that he did not have to talk with me if he did not want to and that he could refuse to answer any questions he was uncomfortable answering. Your complainant also informed the doctor that the door was unlocked and that he was free to leave at any time. Your complainant produced a written waiver of the doctor patient privilege signed by **The and his mother. It was addressed to DR. REPICE and indicated:

hereby give you permission to disregard any doctor patient confidentiality regarding my case. Furthermore, I request that you cooperate and answer questions that may be asked of you by police officers of the Winona Police Department.

DR. REPICE appeared to read the permission slip and then handed it back to your complainant.

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DR. REPICE said he believed that stress and pain were legitimate and that did not want the Demerol just for the effect. DR. REPICE reviewed emergency room medical records and mentioned that on September 30, 1989, when came into the emergency room, DR. REPICE was working there and noted that was "writhing in pain." DR. REPICE said that was tiving in different places at the time and that himself an emancipated minor. He also discussed with your complainant other occasions when Demerol or other medications were administered, apparently without parental consent.

DR. REPICE indicated that on October 5 when the was discharged from the hospital he drove him home. He said he prescribed sleeping pills and told to take one pill each night for three days. Following that DR. REPICE saw an improvement in 's condition and headaches. DR. REPICE said he did not know if that was because of the medication or because they had had a lot of time to talk. DR. REPICE said he had given at least two shots of Demerol to at his home but no more than three.

DR. REPICE said that on October 15 called him at home from the hospital in Rochester and indicated that he did not have anyone to pick him up. DR. REPICE agreed to go to Rochester and pick him up. While at the hospital the nurses on duty gave DR. REPICE the instructions on treatment recommended by the Mayo Clinic doctors. DR. REPICE said that those instructions included avoiding narcotics. DR. REPICE denied giving a shot of

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Demerol on the 15th but said that did develop a headache on the way home. DR. REPICE said that October 16 was the last time he'd given Demerol to

DR. REPICE said he saw at the clinic on October 23 and made a referral. He said the next time he saw was on December 11 when he was admitted to the hospital. Your complainant asked DR. REPICE what he and talked about when they were together. DR. REPICE said that sometimes they would just walk around the lake and talk about what was happening with a relationships at home. DR. REPICE said frequently would give him a call during the day and just want to talk. DR. REPICE said it was very difficult to avoid a call like that.

DR. REPICE confirmed that he was unable to catheterize when he was admitted to the hospital on December 11 and that he had asked another doctor to take over the case. DR. REPICE said that called him that night and told him that he did not overdose on purpose but that he had missed three nights of medication; consequently, in order to get his level back up he had taken 15 tablets at once. DR. REPICE said-that on the atternoon before the overdose had telephoned him and that he went over to talk with the said that was unusually happy because he wasn't letting anything bother him.

Your complainant asked if REPICE ever recalled talking with 's father about counseling. DR. REPICE said that when had been discharged from chemical dependancy treatment the doctor asked him to follow up with DR. REPICE said that on December 30, 1988, he had a 45 minute discussion with home. At the clinic where they discussed topics such as home life, school, triends, drugs, and sexuality. DR. REPICE said these were the basic types of questions asked when there is a suspected psychogenic or psychological cause for distress. DR. REPICE said he came to believe that there was an alcohol problem even though would not admit to it. DR. REPICE said an appointment was made for a three week follow up but that did not appear. DR. REPICE said that he then called the state of find out if was all right. It was at that time that DR. REPICE learned from father that was in treatment.

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Your complainant asked DR. REPICE if he usually made house calls for patients. DR. REPICE replied, "Occasionally." When your complainant asked for the names of other patients he made house calls for, DR. REPICE couldn't think of any. DR. REPICE said it was not unusual for him to give patients a ride home. DR. REPICE indicated that he did not keep records of his house calls. DR. REPICE said that was especially true with because there were so many calls and because of the ongoing care.

DR. REPICE confirmed that he had removed himself from case in December, 1989, because he was too emotionally involved. DR. REPICE said that he got physically sick to his stomach when he saw the lab people drawing blood. When he tried to put the catheter in REPICE said it was like watching it happen to his own child. At that time he knew it was time to turn the case over to another doctor.

Your complainant then asked DR. REPICE if he had given any other suggestions to as ways to relieve tension. DR. REPICE said that he had told to talk to his tather, his mother and sister to resolve conflicts with them. He also recommended psychiatric care. Your complainant asked DR. REPICE if he had told to try masterbating. DR. REPICE replied. "Oh. god. no." DR. REPICE indicated that had had told him that he had masterbated. When your complainant asked when that occurred. DR. REPICE said that it was during one of the sessions in his office when they discussed sexuality. DR. REPICE said that he had asked that if he had masterbated and that he replied affirmatively. DR. REPICE said that he also asked that he had any problems with his sexuality and that he had responded negatively. DR. REPICE knew had a girlfriend.

DR. REPICE also indicated that one Thursday he had gone to the Boy Scout office in Rochester to pick up some equipment and that he had taken with him. He also confirmed that he did invite to spend the night at his house on one occasion.

In regard to going to the YMCA DR. REPICE did confirm he had taken to the YMCA because he thought that a sauna or whirlpool might help headaches. DR. REPICE indicated other people were present and that he had not registered

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as a quest. DR. REPICE confirmed that it was customary not to wear swim suits in the sauna or whirlpool.

Your complainant asked DR. REPICE if he could ever recall giving a back rub. DR. REPICE said there were two occasions when he dave back rubs. Your complainant then asked DR. REPICE it he had ever rubbed buttocks. DR. REPICE said that asked him to rub his buttocks because they had hurt when he had gotten the shots. DR. REPICE said, "Foolishly, I did it in order to calm down." DR. REPICE said that pants were down when he rubbed his buttocks. DR. REPICE said that when _____. turned over, he had rubbed _____ stomach and chest. Your complainant asked DR. REPICE if his hand had touched penis. DR. REPICE said that as he was rubbing stomach, his (REPICE'S) hand did "accidentally" brush up against penis. DR. REPICE said that frightened him and that he then pulled pants up. When your complainant asked DR. REPICE what happened after he pulled s pants up, DR. REPICE said he waited until went to sleep and then left. DR. REPICE said he had no intention of touching sexually and that he had given the back rubs just to try to relax him so that he could get to sleep.

Your complainant then asked if he discussed the incident with Dr. REPICE said that a couple of days later he and discussed the incident due to the quitt REPICE was feeling over diving him the back rubs, since that was not normal treatment for a physician. Again DR. REPICE wanted to emphasize that the back rubs were to relax Your complainant asked DR. REPICE if he apologized for Louching penis. DR. REPICE said he did even though he didn't feel he had to, since it was an accident. Your complainant then asked it they discussed what this might do to the doctor's career. DR. REPICE said he told that diving him back rubs could be construed as sex abuse and could ruin his career and his family. DR. REPICE said responded by brushing it off and told him not to think about it. DR. REPICE said that always said that he knew that DR. REPICE was trying to help him. DR. REPICE said in response to a question that he could not determine when the incident took place by examining any records. However, DR. REPICE said he
