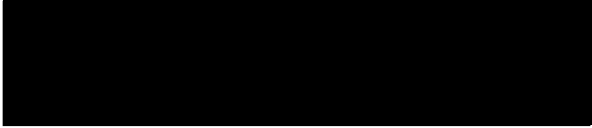

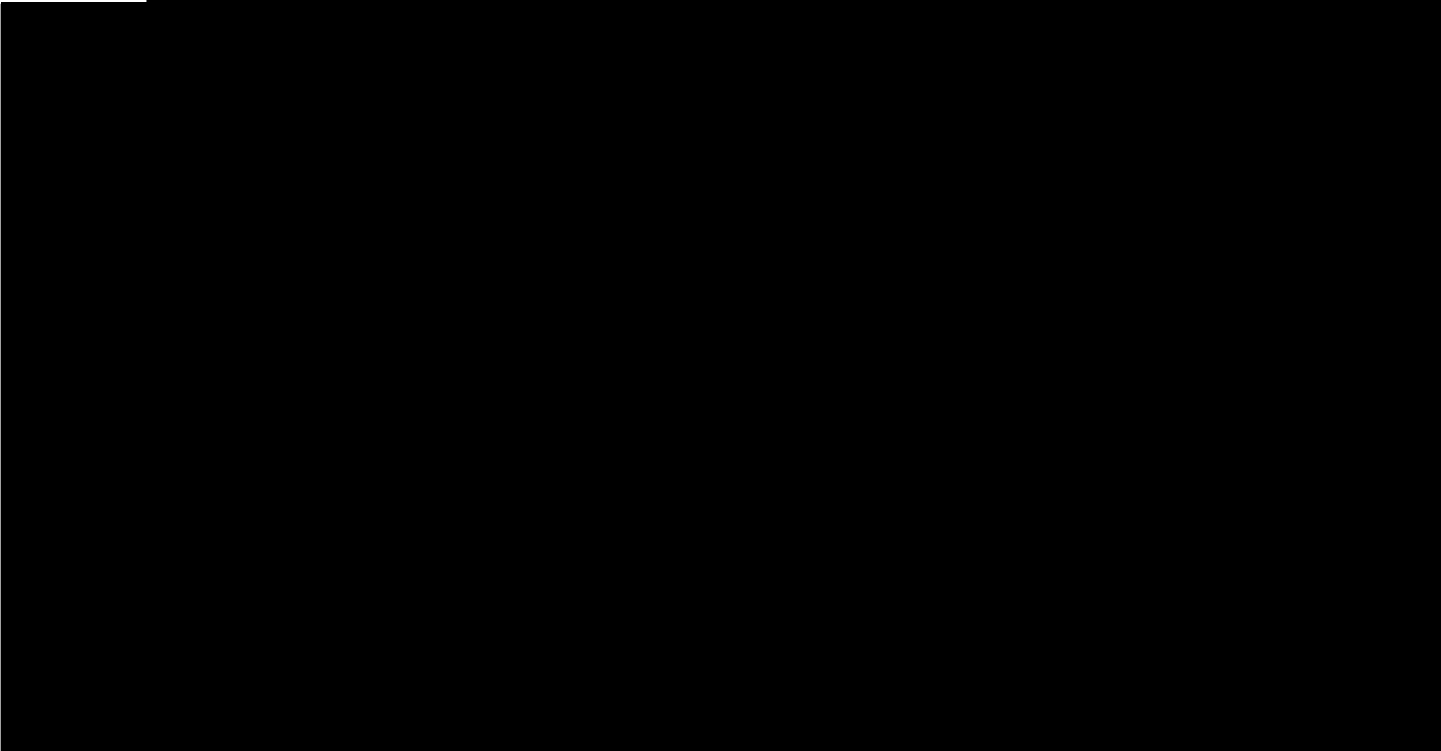
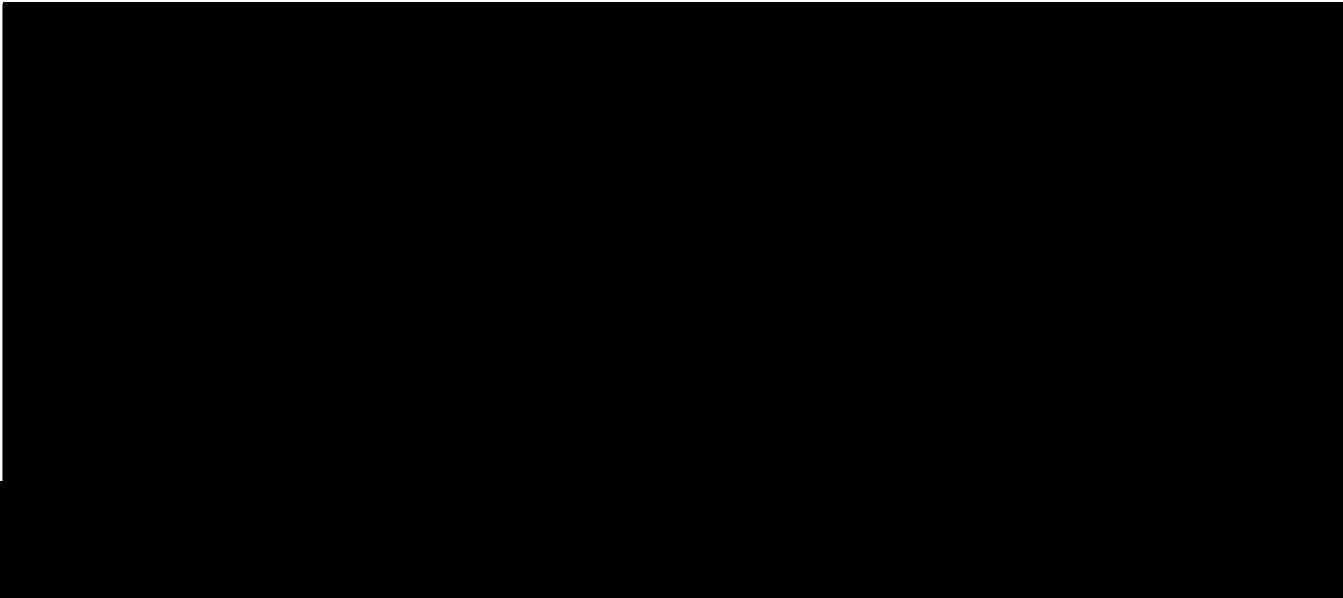

Ex-Scout leader faces sex charges

CANYON LAKE - A Comal County grand jury Wednesday indicted a former Boy Scout volunteer on six counts of indecency with a

child involving five boys, charging that he allegedly fondled them or exposed himself to them at a Boy Scout camp near here earlier this year.

Kenneth Clark, 28, who was a volunteer at the El Rancho Cimarron Scout Camp at the time of the alleged assaults, has been free since he posted \$15,000 bond when he first was arrested in June on two charges of indecency with a child.

At the time, Comal County Sheriff's Department Lt. Rudy Rubio said several other cases were pending against Clark and would be presented to a grand jury.

County officials said Clark could be asked to put up a higher bond and be arrested again on the additional four charges after state District Judge Robert Pfeuffer reviews the indictment today.

Three indictments were returned against Clark Wednesday.

The first alleges Clark committed indecency with one child twice, on April 21 and June 13. The second alleges he committed the same crime with three different children also on June 13. And the third indictment alleges the same crime involving yet another child, also on June 13.

Scouting officials said Clark, an assistant scout master, was dismissed immediately from the voluntary post after the alleged crimes were reported.

None of the boys was from San Antonio.

Sex charges hit ex-scout leader

NEW BRAUNFELS - A former Canyon Lake Boy Scout Troop leader was charged in three indictments Wednesday with six counts of indecency with a child stemming from allegations made after a scout camp retreat.

Kenneth Clark, 28, of the 100 block of Water Oak Lane at Canyon Lake was indicted by a Comal County grand jury.

He is currently free on \$15,000 bond, posted June 19 at the time of his initial arrest.

Court records show Clark, a former volunteer leader with Canyon Lake Scout Troop No. 320, is accused in five incidents that occurred June 13 and one on April 21.

The victims are five boys ages 11-13, records show.

The June 13 incidents occurred during a retreat at El Rancho Cima, a Canyon Lake scout camp owned by the Houston-based Sam Houston Area Council of Boy Scouts.

Residents of an apartment complex on the near North Side were without water for three days because the owner left town and didn't pay the water bill, officials said.

Tenants — some of whom had gone without showers for three days — seemed ecstatic Wednesday night when officials of the City Water Board agreed to turn the water back on after meeting with many of them.

The water went back on Wednesday night.

"A bath!" exclaimed resident Vickie Colbath after the agreement was reached. "I'm going to take a long cool bath. I'm going to go down the drain with it."

The water will stay on until July 4, when the lienholder, Caprock Savings and Loan of Lubbock, is expected to foreclose on the property and assume ownership.

CWB spokesman John Foggess said the owner of the complex "defaulted on the payment, left town and

we have been unable to contact him."

The owner left the complex about two weeks ago without paying a water bill that had climbed to about \$12,100, Boggess said.

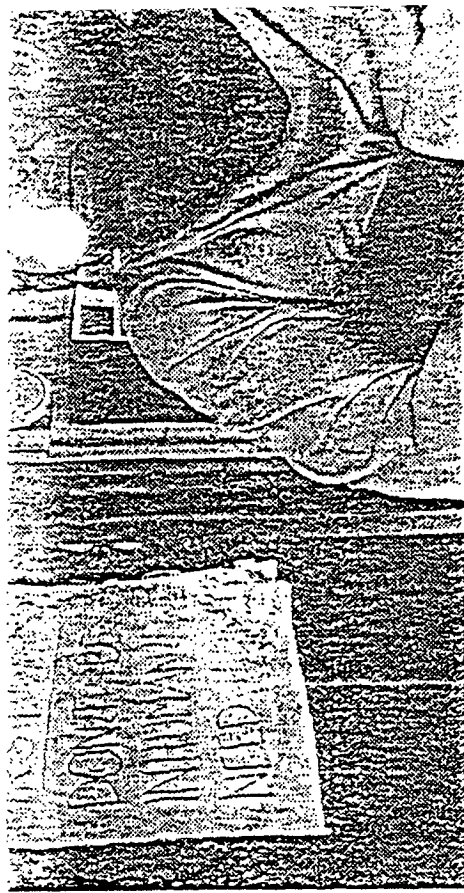
Richard Houghtling, a former security guard at the complex, said the owner left without telling residents of the water situation.

The owner, who was believed to be attending a religious convention in Tennessee, did not return telephone calls from the Express-News to a Tennessee hotel Wednesday.

The water was first shut off Friday, Boggess said.

"But someone came out and turned the water back on and smashed the meter beyond repair," Boggess said. "We removed the meter and turned the water back off Monday."

Since then, the estimated 50 families who live in the 97-unit complex have had to haul water or use water from the swimming pool to cook, flush toilets and take baths, residents said. Some residents arranged to buy bottled water from the Utopia Waters company.



Brentwood Club Apartments resident Harriet Hodges posted her sentiments

After a company driver, Toby Hernandez, learned of the situation, he arranged for delivery of free bottled water.

Residents contacted the CWB, and the Wednesday night meeting was set.

Charles Wachter, the CWB director of credit and collections, told res-

idents he could understand why someone turned the water back over the weekend, although it was an illegal act.

Boggess said notices were hung on apartment doorknobs to notify tenants that the water would be turned off "but someone came and removed our notices."

Scout aide accused of indecency with scouts

CANYON LAKE — An assistant Boy Scout leader has been charged with indecency with a child. The sheriff's office said two scouts told of incidents at an area camp last winter and this month, and there may be more.

One incident involved fondling and the other exposure while the suspect was acting as an assis-

tant scoutmaster, sheriff's Sgt. Dennis Koeppe said.

Investigators on Wednesday continued to interview other possible victims who were at El Rancho China Scout Camp on Ranch Road 32 in December and June.

"Two of the kids came forward and we filed charges. Other kids came forward and said this also happened to them. We're going to take those cases to the district attorney," Koeppe said.

Kenneth Clark, 28, a San Antonio grocery store clerk, charged with indecency with a child by exposure, and by contact, has been released from Comal County Jail after posting bonds totaling \$15,000 set by Justice of the Peace Howard Smith.

Koeppe said several boys between the ages of 10 and 13 told authorities in early June that they watched or had been victimized in December and June incidents.

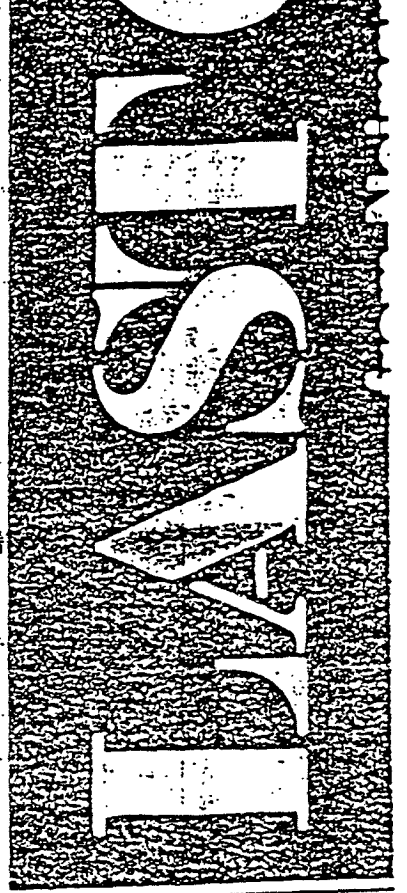
A 25 percent raise given to the second-ranked administrator in Commissioners Court has been revoked.

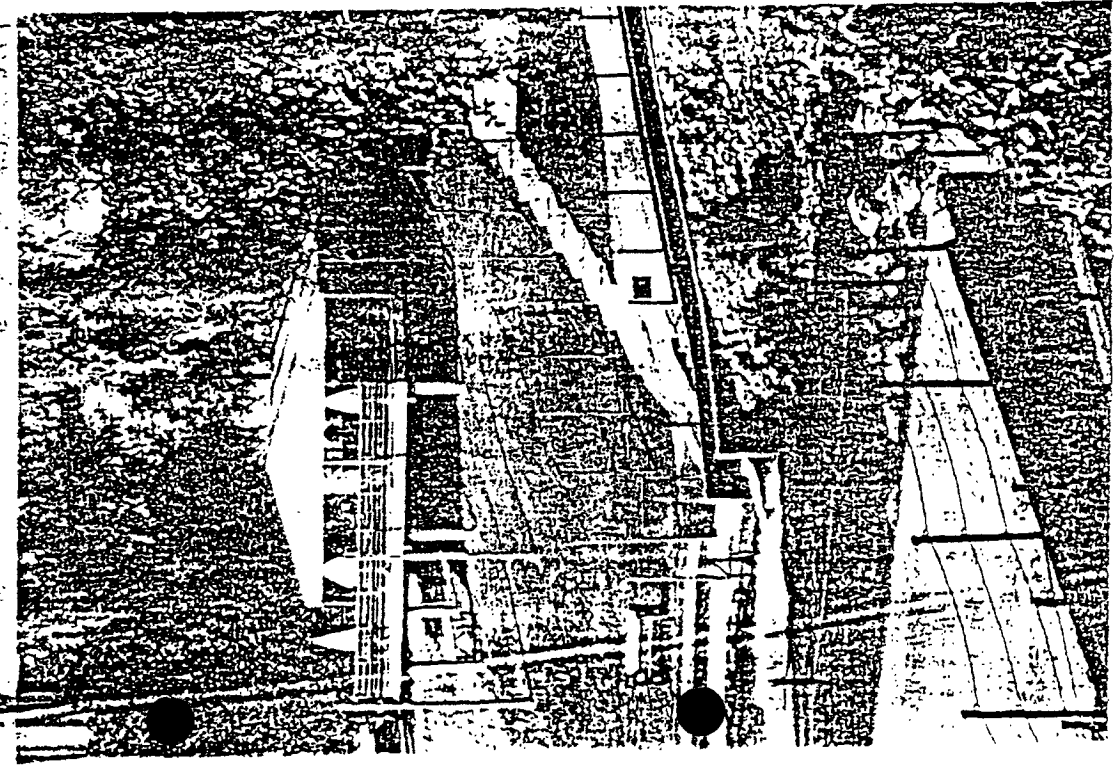

Scout master arrested on indecency charges

An assistant scout master is out on \$15,000 bond from the Comal County jail today after he was charged Monday with two charges of indecency with a child.

Kenneth Clark, 28, Canyon Lake, was arrested Monday after a Comal County sheriff's office investigation

linked him to a June 13 incident at the El Rancho Sima Boy Scout Camp where two 11-year-old boys were reportedly molested. One bond was set at \$10,000 while the other was at \$5,000.

Clark turned himself in to authorities after Sgt. Detective Dennis Koepp called him at work and said he had two warrants issued for his arrest.

Koepp said Clark had been involved with the camp since December 1988.

"We're presenting other cases to the district attorney for his consideration in case he wants to take it to the grand jury," said Chief Deputy Wayne Hoberz.

AT APPROXIMATELY 6:45 PM BILL PHILLIPS APPROACHED ME TO INFORM ME OF AN INCIDENT OF HIS ASST. SCOUT MASTER FONDLING SOME SCOUTS. IT SEEMS THAT THEY HAD HELD A TROOP SWIM AT COONS Ledge WHEN IN THE WATER HE HAD FONDLED SOME SCOUTS AND APPROACHED OTHERS.

THERE HAD ALSO BEEN AN INCIDENT WHEN SOME SCOUTS HAD WITNESSED THE ASST MASTER BATING IN HIS TENT.

WE IMMEDIATELY CONFRONTED [REDACTED] WITH THIS NEW FOUND INFORMATION. AFTER A BRIEF DISCUSSION IT WAS DECIDED TO GO TO THE SITE AND QUESTION THE SCOUTS.

WE DROVE TO THE CAMP SITE WHERE WE QUESTIONED ALL SCOUTS INVOLVED AND FOUND THE STORIES TO BE FACTUAL. AT THIS POINT WE ASKED THE LEADER TO ATTEND A MEETING AT THE RESERVATION DIRECTORS HOUSE. (IT TOOK AT LEAST 3 HOURS TO INFORM BOTH SCOUT EXECUTIVES)

DRIVING THIS TIME THE LEADER WAS TOLD TO REMAIN ON THE PORCH. HE NEVER ONCE QUESTIONED WHY HE WAS THERE AND NOT BACK IN HIS SITE. IT BECAME APPARENT TO ME THAT HE WAS NOT QUITE ALL THERE MENTALLY.

AFTER WE GOT PERMISSION FROM THE SCOUT EXECUTIVES THE LEADER WAS INFORMED HE WAS SUSPENDED FROM SCOUTING. HE DID NOT QUESTION THIS UNTIL LEAVING HIS CAMP SITE. HE ASKED IF HE HAD "TAUGHT SOMETHING ~~WAS~~ WRONG OR WHAT". HE WAS EXPLAINED ONCE AGAIN OF THE REASON FOR HIS SUSPENSION. HE LEFT THE PROPERTY AT AROUND 12:00 AM. THE COUNTY SHERIFF CAME TO THE CAMP TO MAKE A REPORT AND SCOUTS INVOLVED WERE ALLOWED TO CALL HOME.





he contacted the parents. He also informed the Comal County Sheriff office of these new events as well as the Alamo Area Council.
