Dismissal considered in sex case

A Texas law requiring corroboration of accusers' statements in particular sex crime cases may lead to dismissal of a sexual abuse charge against a former Odessa Boy Scout leader.

The law mandates that sex-related complaints filed more than six months after an alleged offense must be substantiated by other evidence.

Lack of such evidence to support a 13-year-old boy's accusations prompted prosecutors this week to seek dismissal of a sexual abuse indictment against Kenneth Alford, 47, 1016 Ave. G.

Alford was indicted by an Ector County grand jury Sept. 9 on for an alleged August 1982 sexual molestation. Judge Joe Connally of the 244th Judicial District received a prosecutor's recommendation to dismiss the charge. He was expected to make a ruling today.

Alford's indictment stemmed from statements given by the boy to Ector County sheriff's deputies almost a year after the alleged incident. But Ector County Assistant District Attorney Anthony Foster said Wednesday that authorities could find no evidence to substantiate the teen-ager's charge. It was just a swearing match between Mr. Alford and the 13-year-old."

Despite the lack of evidence, Foster said an indictment against Alford was pursued "because there was some concern about it at the time."

But Richard Keen, Alford's defense attorney, said Wednesday his client has no prior criminal record and has maintained from the beginning that he is innocent.

"This man has traumatized," Keen said. "He was up there demanding a speedy trial so he could get this cleaned up and get back to his Boy Scout troop."

Boy Scout executive Steve Odom said today that Alford, an assistant scout master for Troop No. 57, was dropped from the organization when the charges were filed.

"The fact that the charges were dropped, we really don't know what that means," Odom said. "It's all kind of in limbo as far as the Boy Scouts are concerned."

If convicted of the second-degree felony, Alford faced a maximum 20-year prison term. "You're talking about serious prison time if you're convicted," Keen said. "I think that the mere seriousness of the offense requires

you be careful about what kind of evidence is admitted."

The attorney said if the case had gone to trial, several of Alford's scouts would have been willing to testify in his behalf.

Attorneys said the law leading to the dismissal is designed to prevent prosecution on false charges.

Ector County District Attorney Mike Holmes said that in most sex-related offenses, the victim confides with a friend or relative shortly after the incident, an occurrence lawyers term "outcry."

When there is no immediate outcry, Holmes said, "it casts a doubt on whether there was an offense."

"I'm not saying that's what happened here, but you can see that, potentially, a person might get mad at another party, come in and say, 'That's what happened to me two years ago,'" Holmes said.

In sex offenses involving children, Holmes said, fear can prevent the victim from confiding in another.

"Those kinds of things are usually followed up by 'don't tell anybody," Holmes said.

Keen said that in his client's case, the law worked as it was intended. "In this case, justice was 'served," Keen said. "I just wish it could have been served without an indictment and all the publicity."

Pursuant to your letter of May 29, 1984, I chaired the Review Committee composed of Mr. Ron Farquhar and Mr. Whitey Harrington. Tom McSwain served as the Staff Adviser for the Review Committee. This committee first met on Monday, June 18, 1984 and reviewed the evidence which had transpired to that date. The committee also interviewed Mr. Kenneth Alford and Scout Master Bob Bone. The Review Committee met again on October 15, 1984 and unanimously reached the decision there was sufficient evidence to substantiate a denial of registration for Mr. Kenneth Alford. This decision was based mainly on the following findings of fact:

- 1. Mr. Alford testified before the committee that he had never been arrested before, but it was later discovered, with his permission, that he had in fact been on felony probation and had had other arrests involving moral turpitude.
- 2. Mr. Alford testified that he never had boys individually at his house, but other witnesses contradicted that statement.
- 3. Mr. Alford testified that he was an Eagle Scout and had been an Assistant Scout Master in California, but none of the statements were reported with the National Headquarters.
- 4. This is the second separate incident involving Mr. Alford and a young boy. Mr. Alford also stated that felony charge against him had been dropped because he had been cleared, but in fact that was not the predominant reason for dismissal.

I hope that this decision and the above memorandum will conclude the work of the Review Committee. If anything further is needed
