Melbourne, a member of the dinner party, said he drove Jerrilyn Mullins to the Howard Johnson motel in Woodbury where her car was parked after her husband drove away from Chi Chi's without her. He said he had found the woman, who had left a table in the restaurant some time earlier, in the parking lot and that he offered to let her into his car to keep warm.

Mullins testified Thursday he was angered when he saw his wife in Melbourne's arms in a car in Chi Chi's parking lot. He said he drove off after he saw Melbourne charging across the parking lot.

"I didn't want a confrontation there," he said. Mullins and the 28-year-old woman had been married only 2½ months.

Her decomposed body was found June 30, 1979, in a Lake Elm's swamp, near 10th Street and east of Interstate 694. Despite two autopsies, no cause of death could be determined and no criminal charges have ever been filed.

Before instructing the jury about 11:30 a.m. Friday, Metzen ordered a second defendant, TRW Vidar Corp. of Hastings, who had been Melbourne's employer, dropped from the case.

According to testimony, it was a TRW attorney who advised Melbourne not to let authorities search his car without a warrant and not to talk to police without an attorney present.

Melbourne's car was searched nearly a month after the woman's death, and it was clean. Melbourne testified that employees with company cars had to clean them once a month.

In her closing arguments, Deborah Ellis, Melbourne's attorney, called Mullins' charges "false accusations" prompted by Mullins' guilt and embarrassment for stranding his wife at Chi Chi's.

Ellis also suggested that the woman may have returned home in her car and that Mullins, who was angry, may have killed her, dumped her body and returned the car to the Howard Johnson loc.

However, police said the car had not been moved from the lot, and a search found no signs of foul play.

Ellis also suggested that Jerrilyn Mullins may have wandered into the swamp after she broke away from someone else who picked her an and drove her to an area known as a lover's lane.

Raising Melbourne's criminal record, Ellis asked if his conviction in 1970 in Ohio (for breaking into a young woman's home and beating her) meant that "Melbourne is not likely to teil the truth."

Since Jerrilyn Mullins' death. Melbourne has been convicted twice in Dakota County. In 1980, he was convicted of child abuse and sentenced to 90 days in jail, with 60 days suspended. He was convicted in 1983 to a year in Dakota County Jail and 10 years' probation for second-degree criminal sexual assault involving a 10-year-old neighbor girl.

In her closing remarks, Ellis asked the jury if Melbourne's lying about his educational background on a job application "makes him a murderer."

Charles Faulkner, Mullins' attorney, told the jury "the evidence shows that Patrick Melbourne killed Jerrilyn Mullins"

He noted that Dr. John Plunkett, Dakota County coroner, testified that undigested food in the victim's stomach indicated she died within two hours after she ate. Plunkert said toxicology tests showed a 0.10 percent alcohol count in the body, and 0.15 percent in the brain tissue.

Plunkett also testified that the woman had a broken bone in her left hand, which Faulkner said was consistent with her trying to fight off an assailant.

Faulkner also said that yellow fibers on the soles of the victim's shoes found during the autopsy showed "she never got out of (Melbourne's) car. She was killed and her body dumped," he insisted.

Faulkner contended that Melbourne took a shower in his basement, rather than upstairs, when he got home "to clean off the mud, dirt and debris."

"He took advantage of Jerrilyn Mullins after she had been drinking," and he killed her, the attorney said.

Washington County sheriff's officers who worked on the case could not be reached Friday for comment. Faulkner and Mullins were also unavailable.

The jury also determined that if compensatory damages were allowed, the amount would be \$255,667.



He was convicted in 1983 to a year in Dakota County Jail and 10 years' probation for second-degree criminal sexual assault involving a 10-year-old neighbor girl.

In her closing remarks, Ellis asked the jury if Melbourne's lying about his educational background on a job application "makes him a murderer."

Charles Faulkner, Mullins' attorney, told the jury "the evidence shows that Patrick Meibourne killed Jerrilyn Mullins"

He noted that Dr. John Plunkett, Dakota County coroner, testified that undigested food in the victim's stomach indicated she died within, two hours after she ate. Plunkett said toxicology tests showed a 0.10 percent alcohol count in the body, and 0.15 percent in the brain tissue.

Plunkett also testified that the woman had a broken bone in her left hand, which Faulther said was consistent with her left to fight off an assailant.

Faulkner also sate that yellow fibers on the soles of the victim's shoes found during the autopsy showed "she never got out of (Melbourne's) car. She was killed and her body dumped," he insisted.

Faulkner contended that Mekbourne took a shower in his basement, rather than upstairs, when he got home "to clean off the mud, dirt and debris."

"He took advantage of Jerrilyn Mullins after she had been drinking," and he killed her, the attorney said.

Washington County sheriff's officers who worked on the case could not be reached Friday for comment. Faulkner and Mullins were also unavailable.

The jury also determined that if compensatory damages were allowed, the amount would be \$255,667.
