

I am reporting to you by my best recollection Carlson's own version of the incident.

At that time I reviewed with Carlson our process of volunteer selection and told him that in my judgment, based on his statement concerning the incident, that he was no longer considered to be a proper volunteer for the Boy Scouts of America. Mr. Carlson told me he would resign. I received his letter of resignation on September 21, 1987.

Since that time Mr. Carlson has expressed an interest in taking back his letter of resignation. In a conversation with you Paul, around the first part of the year, you indicated to me that you concurred with my decision and we should begin the process of formally suspending Mr. Carlson's registration. I met with Mr. Carlson on Tuesday, January 19 and gave him the attached suspension letter. Due to the sensitivity of Carlson's employer as a major donor to the council and his major involvement in Scouting, I did not involve a volunteer in an attempt to be as confidential as possible.

I have enclosed copies of my entire file on Carlson as well as a copy of his signature for your file. He indicated when the letter was delivered he may appeal this process. I shared with him the process. Let me know if there is any additional information you need to complete your files.



To Whom It May Concern:

I have been asked to briefly describe and outline my understanding as to Mr. Carlson's behaviors with the subminime years ago which have subsequently raised questions as to his suitability to remain with the Boy Scouts of America programs.

Very briefly, Mr. Carlson has acknowledged that on three occasions, nine or ten years ago, he exercised very poor judgement of blurring the boundaries of propriaty These incidents included some body contact but no genital or frankly sexual contact. It is my belief as I understand the facts no abuse occurred beyond the misuse of an otherwise healthy relationship.

It is hoped these comments will help determine Mr. Carlson's fitness to continue his involvement with the Boy Scouts of America.

I am writing this letter with a very heavy heart.

My Scouting experience as a youth began as a Cub Scout at the age of eight. It was terminated approximately twelve years later when I left Explorer Post #490 in Stillwater.

I served two to three years as an Assistant Scoutmaster for Troop #113 in Bayport during the mid-sixties.

I did not re-register with the program until August of 1981 at which time I joined the Troop Committee of Troop #113. I have been active with the Troop as a Committee Member, Committee Chairman, Advancement Chairman, and as a Merit Badge Counselor since that time. I also served on the Pack Committee and spent two enjoyable years as the Webelos Leader for Pack #113.
