

Dear Mr. Wilson:

A short time ago I received a phone call from the Johnstown Chief of Police and Mayor (who is on our Executive Board) signifing two Scouters who had been charged by the police department on a morals charge. They indicated that these cases would come before the courts on August 6, 1962.

The results of these hearings leave no doubt that worth Scouters are guilty as charged and should be removed from the ranks of Scouting. May I request that their names be placed on our confidential file and removed from the registration records at our National Office.

The basic history of the two men charged is as follows:

A. Robert B. Updyke, age 25, living at Building 47, Apt. B, Oakhurst Homes, Jekhstown, Pennsylvania. Mr. Updyke served as Assistant Scoutmaster and Scoutmaster of (roop 186, sponsored by the Oakhurst Citizens Group from March, 1959, to October, 1960; the was asked to resign by the Committee following a number of reports by parents that his actions during targing trips was suspicious. He has not been registered in Scouting since that time, but no definite proof of his guilt was evident until yesterday's session in court. Even though he is not currently registered, we are certain that any reregistration on his part at a future time would be detrimental to Scouting.
