RE: BACKGROUND REGARDING TOM WOOD

On or about late April or early May I received a phone call from an anonymous individual who was obviously the mother of a youngster who felt her son had been molested by a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America. She called me in an attempt to gather information regarding an activity that had happened at a Boy Scout camp. I was unaware at that time who the perpetrator was or who the victim was. Within a short period of time I received a call from Detective Manny Smith, an officer with the San Diego Police Department, indicating that they were investigating a situation with Tom Wood and the victim was identified and this would indicate that probably my conversation with the mother earlier was indeed the same individual.

I cooperated with Detective Smith and gave him information regarding the Scout Troop where they met and the members. Upon learning that they were going to arrest Mr. Wood, I felt the information I had at that time warranted us to suspend his registration. Shortly after I met with the Scout Troop parents and discussed the situation and for the most part everyone was supportive of the action by the council, with exception of a couple of people. Many people, in cases of this type, express surprise and feel it just couldn't happen.

I then notified Mr. Harrington of this information. He subsequently indicated that it should be sent back to us for review and so indicated to Mr. Wood. In my attempt to gather a committee to review the situation we had some problems as resulted with our attorney and several others who were difficult to get together, but I asked for information from Detective Manny Smith regarding the incident. He indicated there may not be a need for review because they found what they felt was another victim and they were in the process of following up on that case. I communicated that to Mr. Wood and suggested that perhaps he ought to find out what charges would be actually brought against him. Subsequently we have received an additional request from Mr. Wood regarding his membership status. By the enclosed copy I have sent the same information to Paul Ernst and suggested he be placed on the confidential file. I understand that Mr. Parker has talked to Manny Smith and I am sure with a request from your office, Mr. Smith would provide you with some type of written information regarding his feelings and findings.

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
