None of the material which you sent us seems to indicate either of these problems. I do not know if I missed some of these items or if they were not specifically outlined in the correspondence which you sent. There was one place where it indicated that some inappropriate behavior had been reported, but no one seemed to have any indication of with whom or at what time. If you can document any of this, it would certainly help and give us a complete file which will lead to refusal of future registration anywhere Mr. Hopkins might attempt it.

Attached is information I have received from Marie Marecek, Pack 59 Committee Chairman (and elementary school counselor) in Black River Falls, Wisconsin; Investigator Mark Holmgreen, Black River Falls Police Department; the telephone reference check I completed at your request; plus a few items from our files.

A couple of other items for your information:

- 1. The reason the camp director did not let Tim Hopkins stay in our camp when he arrived on Sunday, July 17 was that the director thought he had been involved in unusual circumstances with Scouting in Black River Falls and had been asked to resign from the pack and/or troop and was not registered. He resisted our attempts to have him leave camp as he did a few years ago. Our Camp Ranger knows about both of these incidents.
- 2. Leona McLaughlin, the reference Tim Hopkins gave, suggested I contact Marie Marecek for further information. I had planned to do so anyway. I was not able to contact Marie, who was out of town on vacation until late last week.
- 3. The copy of the Black River Falls "Police Record" is related to Tim Hopkins permitting an 11 year old to steer his vehicle (a truck according to the description) with 7 other Scouts in it in 1986.
- 4. Items are hopefully attached in sequence as they occurred.

Please let me know your council's and the National Council's disposition of the registration of Mr. Hopkins. Thank you for your patience.





Dear Pastor Gary:

Once again it is the time of year for Pack 59 to renew their charter. Upon reviewing your charter from last year, I find there are some areas that you need to be aware of. Thus being, not having an active pack committee and not having a male Webelos Leader for your 10 year old boys.

I understand your Cubmaster, Tim Hopkins, has been taking over these responsibilities. It is with our concern that we are breaking the rules of the National Council by not having a separate Webelos Leader. By our rules and regulations, the Cubmaster cannot be the Webelos Leader.

As we undertake the new, improved Cubbing program for this year, I feel it is necessary that you have leadership that would work through a Pack Committee to see that more boys in the Black River Falls area and from your church benefit from this great program of Cub Scouting.

Although your Cubmaster has been trained, I feel he is not putting his training into practice and if he is unwilling to put into practice what he has been trained, then I feel it would be necessary for your and your Education Committee to recruit an active Pack Committee that would oversee the operation of the Cub Pack and that some criteria be set by your Education Committee, the same as they would with your Sunday. School teachers, etc.

Pastor, I am sure you are aware of what we now are stressing in having as many of our units a "Quality Unit" with the criteria as set forth in the charter application. I am pleased with the Evangelical Lutheran Church's sponsorship and that many boys from Black River Falls have and are receiving a good Scouting experience, but feel that the pack should be able to qualify for a Quality unit status. I am not talking about qualifying on paper, I am talking about qualifying as an active unit. The Council last year was a Quality Council and we only became a Quality Council because of the number of Quality units in our council. We are striving to be a Quality Council this year.

If I or our District Executive Donn Valenti can be of any assistance, please do not hesitate to call upon us.

Dear Pastor McMannus:

On behalf of my son, which was I wish to express my concern of his apprehensiveness and fear of his scout leader, Tim Hopkins. I base the fact that he is fearful of Tim by his refusing to attend Cub Scout meetings and being gone from home when he thought Tim would be coming by.

The following are incidences that reported to me that I feel you should be aware of: While driving and to Granddad's Bluff in La Crosse during the last school year, Tim drove erratically and frightened them.

While on Granddad's Bluff, he held over the railings at the top of the bluff and sat him on the small area on the other side of the fence, again frightening the He later adjusted the belt on the jeans which did not like.

The Cub Scout group stayed overnight at Tim's cabin around Christmas where again became frightened because of the ghost stories Tim told them.

When I picked up the next morning, he stated "I never want to stay there again."

At a routine meeting , , and were in the room.

Tim had and go into the hallway where heard them being slammed around which again frightened .

After that time stopped going to Scouts. When did not go to Scouts, Tim stopped by the house after the regular Scout meeting to see and ask him why he did not attend. Apparently told Tim he would attend the next meeting. did not attend and when Tim stopped by the next day, he was angry at for not attending like he had promised. Continues to refuse to attend the Scout meetings.

In addition, has left home for the past four Thursdays (Scout meeting days) until he is sure that Tim will not be waiting or stopping in to see him.

Tim also has talked to on several occasions at recess time, when he was on the playground. This really upsets

I am concerned about welfare and his need for socialization with his friends and appropriate male models, especially since I am a single parent, and the cooperation and skill training Scout leaders are to teach young boys. This is first year in Scouts. I believe that rights as an individual are being violated by him being frightened of Tim.

Is there anything that I can do as parent to protect his rights?

I am aware of the fact that other boys have quit this group. Is it because of Tim? I will not force to attend a Scouting event where Tim is in attendance. I have an eight year old son who is not frightened of Tim and he attends Scout meetings on a regular basis. In order to prevent anything from occurring to him, I will not allow to go out of town or have any overnight stays with Tim. I will also not allow him to ride in a vehicle with Tim.

Due to my concern, I have discussed this with Marie Marecek, Everett Larkin, Jim Haldeman, and Pastor Gary McMannus. was interviewed and was considered not to have been sexually abused; however, his fear of Tim and the reasons why should not be overlooked.

Hopefully my writing this letter will alert you to problem and that you can somehow prevent other boys and their parents from having to deal with the same concerns and frustrations I have had with past Scouting experiences. Your help would be greatly appreciated.

To whom it may concern:

This letter is in regard to an incident involving Tim Hopkins and my son which occured at a Webelos meeting on Nov. 6, 1987. The actual incident was a long and drawn out process involving many steps and several other Webelos. I will talk about only the bottom line incidents with further detail upon request. Apparently was sent out of the Webelos meeting room because of a behavior problem. While sitting alone in a chair in a different room of the parish ed building at Tvangelical Lutheran Church, Tim knocked the desk-chair combination over while was: sitting in it and then Tim got down and laid on on the floor between his legs while he told him that none of this would have hardened if had only behaved.

There is a complete interview with availiable upon request to the properly authorized people for whatever investigation they feel would be appropriate. Up to this point in time, everything I know about the situation was from information gathered from talking to

At about 6:30 P.M. that night, Mr. Hopkins came to our home and asked if he could talk to and myself together. When the three of us were together, Mr. Hopkins started a long and drawn-out and very detailed account of what had happened. Many times during the explaination he made the comment that he wouldn't have done any of the things he did, it only had behaved like he should have. After about 10 minutes into his diatribe, I sent out of the room because of the bizaare of in which Mr. Hopkins was acting. His actions and mannerisms are extremely hard to pin-point but needless to say, I felt very uncomfortable and could tell that was also.

His actions were characterized by a wringing of hands, slow and drawn out speech, eyes shutting as if in a trance and a constant denial of his actions with repeated sayings of "If had only listened to me, then I wouldn't have done what I did." After listening to another ten minutes of repeated versions of the same story, I called a halt to the discussion and Mr. Hopkins left. In never attended another meeting of cub scouts after this incident. Many other details are left out of this letter, but I would be availiable to answer questions to anyone who would be doing research into whatever

has to be done, so that this type of incident is not repeated.

Dear Pastor MacManus and Committee Members:

We are addressing you in regard to incidents which occurred at a Webelo Den Meeting on November 6, 1986 between our son, and Tim Hopkins, his Scout leader.

During the meeting was talking and was told to stand in the hallway in silence for 10 minutes. While in the hallway, was tapping his leg with his hand. This prompted Mr. Hopkins to hold him against the wall and to tell that he would throw him down the hallway. He said that he would child abuse was fand that would take him to court and he d be happy.

We immediately voiced a complaint to Pastor MacManus and I had a phone conversation with Mr. Hopkins the morning after the incident at which time he admitted to me that he had threatened in the way described. He made no apology.

Please understand that we do not condone our son's misbehavior - rather we question Mr. Hopkin's method of discipline. We know that Mr. Hopkins did not strike or physically abuse our child but certainly there was verbal abuse. He was very frightened and upset about the whole meeting.

We feel that Mr. Hopkins' conduct is unbecoming to that of a Scoutmaster.

will no longer be attending Webelo meetings as we feel that we cannot trust Mr. Hopkins with this responsibility. We feel that Webelos is not West Point and would let you know that we are concerned about Mr. Hopkins' temper.

Dear Mr. Ritland:

It is with great regret that I feel I must submit my resignation as a scout leader for Pack 59, Troop 59, and the Tiger Cub Group. I do not feel that it is possible to continue filling that position to the best of my ability at this time. I felt that it was only fair that you be given a reason and explanation as to why after approximately eleven years with the Cub Scouts, eight years with the Boy Scouts and three with the Tiger Cubs, I should feel so compelled.

In the fall of 1985 while discussing uniforms etc. with the then just developing junior leadership corps for the troop, Mr. MacManus used a swear word to describe what the boys look like when they are out of uniform or are wearing a sloppy uniform. When I spoke privately with him about this later, he expressed to me his regret in the choice of words that he used.

In February 1986, while at the Whitetail District Klondyke Derby, one of the boys hurt himself. Mr. MacManus said to the scout, "Oooh, Let me kiss it." The boy scout replied, "I'd rather kiss Annie" referring to the dog Mr. MacManus had brought along. Mr. MacManus replied, "Oh, which end?". The scout then told him that he was disgusting and I said "That's not the way for a Boy Scout to talk."

In May 1986 the Boy Scouts of Troop 59 went on a Bike Hike. While sitting around camp that evening, Mr. MacManus told four dirty jokes (that I know of). While telling them, one of the boys told him that he was disgusting, and I agreed with the boy that "Boy Scouts don't tell bathroom jokes." I don't feel that I in good conscience, could be part of any organization which allows this type of example to be put before young people.

In October 1986, at the Pack 59 Planning meeting, Mr. MacManus passed out a copy of the Gateway Area Council newsletter. Then later while discussing the new \$20 registration fee, I informed the committee that this cost was due to the higher insurance rates which the Boy Scouts of America had to pay. He informed the committee that I didn't know what I was talking about, that Sue down at the council didn't know waht she was talking about. However, on the first page of the <u>Gateway</u> it said precisely what I had said.

In November 1986 the boys were once again preparing for a Bike Hike, This time, Mr. MacManus got the boys into a rubber band 'shoot out'. This really was unsafe behavior and not setting a good example.

In April 1987, while at a scouting planning meeting for the Pack, Mr. MacManus went to get a Webelos book to show to the members of the Pack Committee. When I informed the leader he was speaking to that the book was similar to but was not the latest version, he claimed to have gotten it the last time he had been down in La Crosse. This particular book was two years out of print. The Gateway Area Council was not still selling those books.

In May 1987, after one of the confirmation classes, Mr. MacManus was standing outside the church talking to some of the students. He was speaking with a group of boys. When some comment was made, one of the girls standing nearby told them they were being disgusting. Surely as a minister, he should be providing some sort of example to the youth of the church and not encourage such behavior while he is around.

There is also the matter of consistency. When one of the scouts received his advancement last spring, Mr. MacManus commented that he was advancing too quickly. When that scout came up for his next award. Mr. MacManus raised an objection based on one of the requirements. Then in discussions with two of the other committee members, he said that the scout should receive the award, but that it shouldn't happen again. Then when the scout came back to the Board of Review, Mr. MacManus didn't present that story at all. It's difficult to know where you stand when he changes so often.

I also have it on good authority that Mr. MacManus has been at least partially responsible for members of the church leaving and joining other churches in town. I know that personally, my family, while not official members of the church, considered ourselves as such. We would discourage anyone from ever attending services at which he is the minister. There have also been boys who have left the scouting organization rather than have to deal with him. There is only one scouting organization in town and these boys really have no alternative.

Dear Mr. Jansen,

I am writing this letter in response to your telephone call this morning asking for information surrounding the problems Pack and Troop 59 experienced with Mr. Tim Hopkins which led to his no longer being associated with those groups.

First I am sending you copies of some written documents spanning the time period of November 24, 1986 to June 16, 1987.

- !) Letter from Creed Wood to Rev. Gary McManus detailing the need for an active Pack Committee.
- 2) Letters from three parents of Webelos Scouts stating conceens about Mr. Hopkins leadership, judgement and disciplinary measures. All three parents have given on 8-3-1989 permission to send you copies of these letters.
- 3) Copies of letters sent to Committee Members, concerned parents, and Mr.Hopkins regarding action to be taken on letters from parents.
- 4) Minutes of Special Meeting of Pack Committee and statement drafted at that meeting accepting Mr. Hopkins statement that he had "quit".
- 5) Copy of Parish Education meeting minutes Mr. Hopkins resignation -Problems at summer camp.
- 6) Copy of police report -Cub Scout steering Mr. Hopkins truck with other scouts in vehicle.

First I feel I should give you a little history about how I became involved with this process. I have a son who had been in Scouting since 1982. During the first two years of my son's involvement with Scouts, I was very supportive of Mr. Hopkins. He is very enthusiastic and can also be very hard working. My son leader was one of the moms and I only saw Mr. Hopkins at Pack Meetings, where I thought his pack control was poor, but the boys really liked him, he did a lot of silly things and had a lot of energy. At this point I knew little about Scouting as an organization. At that time I would have written a favorable recomendation for Mr. Hopkins.

Then as my son became Webelos age and Mr. Hopkins was his leader, I became more and more concerned about his lack of good judgement, discipline procedures and the excessive amount of physical horseplay between Mr. Hopkins and the boys. This horseplay was encouraged by Mr. Hopkins. About this time I started hearing stories about Mr. Hopkins strange behavior from older boys who

had joined Boy Scouts and quit. I really believed in the Scouting program and my son wanted to stay in Scouting but I was uneasy. I took great care to avoid Mr. Hopkins being alone with ... Mr. Hopkins was always complaining that he couldn't get help but was unwilling to allow anyone to work with him except for token jobs like making tickets or making cookies. As I became more aware of the structure of Scouting I became more and more convinced that this program had much to offer boys but that it was not being properly carried out in Black River Falls.

At about that time as an elementary counselor in the Black River Falls Schools, I initiated a Protective Behaviors Curriculum in our classrooms. As I became more knowledgeable in the child sexual abuse field, I became more and more concerned about the need for a strong parent component in the programs of Pack 59 and Troop 59. At that time Mr. Hopkins was Assistant Scoutmaster, Cubmaster (he did not have an assistant), Webelos leader and Den leader for one den. His pack committee consisted of:

mother of Tim Hopkins who was committee chairperson, Mr. Hopkins and three inactive parents.

After receiving the November 24 letter from Creed Wood and at the urging of our sponsoring organization Evangelical Lutheran Church, a group of parents started meeding as a Pack Committee and when the letters from parents came, that group took the actions indicated in the attached reports.

The letters and reports describe and document Mr. Hopkins lack of good judgement and maturity and his poor discipline methods. However underlying these concerns is a deeper one. I feel I can most safely describe this by detailing some occasions when I have observed Mr. Hopkins and have felt that his behavior was not appropriate.

- 1) A sixth grade boy who had not been attending Scouts showed up at a meeting and was greeted by Mr. Hopkins with a big hug. I could sense the boy's discomfort. He never came to another meeting.
- 2) At a roller skating party, Mr. Hopkins continually chased one young Scout, threatening to grab him. Later this boy told his mother that he was afraid, didn't know what to do as everywhere he went Mr. Hopkins chased him.

  3) Parking cars at the fair. Mr. Hopkins lifting up boys and
- 3) Parking cars at the fair. Mr. Hopkins lifting up boys and standing them on his knees, holding on to their legs to prop them up. Lots of horseplay in between.
- 4) At a chili lunch served by Scouts at church, Mr. Hopkins playfully sitting on a boys lap and moving back and forth.
- 5)At a District training session for both adults and Scouts, I sat next to Mr. Hopkins during a wrap up session. Scouts were sitting in front, adults behind. However a young Scout from another troop wanted to sit next to Mr. Hokins. He allowed this and they apent the time playing with Mr. Hopkins watch putting it on and off each others hands.

6) A parent of a former Cub Scout tells this tory of a day when the Cub Scouts were swimming at a river pond near Mr. Hopkins cabin.

A pattern I saw in Mr. Hopkins behavior was that of putting young boys in a fear position; holding the boy over the fence at GrandDad Bluff (letter from parent) taking his hands off the wheel of his truck and telling the thirteen year old scout he had to steem (police report), chasing the scout at the roller skating rink (my observation), and telling the boy to swim over the swift current (parent description).

It is my theory that he did that to encourage the boys to cling to him or to allow him to cling to them.

Another pattern is playing with boys in a boisterous manner until they get loud and unrulely and then coming down on them with loud and almost violent discipline. It also appeared that Mr. Hopkins would seek out some Webelos and young Boy Scouts for extra attention, he would go to their homes, call them often on the phone, would be upset when parents picked them up instead of Mr. Hopkins being allowed to take them home. The parents of one boy who was treated in this manner have an investigative report filed with the Jackson County Sherrif Department and they are willing to share that with you Mr. Jansen if you feel it would save some other boy from having an unpleasant experience. My son who is now 18 years old has attended camp Decorah with Mr. Hopkins on numerous occasions and has not reported any inappropriate behavior by Mr. Hopkins towards him, but has heard stories from other boys who have quit Scouting.

After Mr. Hopkins disassociated himself with Troop and Pack 59, he immediately started working with a youth Group at the Methodist Church. Black River Falls being a small town, some parents had heard about the concerns in Boy Scouts and asked that he not be directly involved with youth. Mr. Hopkins then went to the workplace of who had written one of the attached letters and went into a loud and angry tirade about how she had ruined his life.

I am sure many parents in Black River Falls join me in being very concerned about Mr. Hopkins being approved as a Boy Scouts of America leader. As we discovered it is not possible to fire a volunteer and persuading a volunteer to quit who is possibly volunteering to fill needs of their own is very, very difficult.
