Molest case sentencing postponed

The sentencing of a former Salinas scoutmaster who molested a teen-age boy was delayed for three months while the man's state of mind is evaluated by officials.

Judge Richard M. Silver ordered Wayne S. Booth committed to the Vacaville State Mental Facility for testing on Thursday. Psychiatric report will be sent to Silver before Booth is sentenced in Monterey County Superior Court. No date has been set.

Booth, a scoutmaster for Troop 45 in Salinas, was arrested Oct. 7 after he took three boys, ages 10, 15 and 16, on an outing at the San Antonio Lake Campgrounds. Booth admitted his molested the 16-year-old after giving alcohol to the youths, according to court records.

Booth had been a scoutmaster since 1979. A Boy Scouts spokesman said the boys were not scouts and the trip was not sanctioned by the Boy Scouts of America.



Man pleads guilty to molestation charge

A 32-year-old Salinas scoutmaster pleaded guilty Wednesday to charges that he molested a 16-year-old boy.

Wayne Spowyer Booth II, a scoutmaster for Troop 45 in Salinas, had been charged with child abuse and contributing to the delinquency of a minor. He will be sentenced Jan. 6.

Booth was arrested Oct. 7 after he took three boys, ages 16, 15 and 10, on an outing at the San Antonio Lake Campgrounds. While at the campground, Booth admitted, he molested the 16-year-old by oral copulation after giving all three alcohol to drink.

Booth, a scoutmaster since 1979, made no statement at his court appearance. Asked by Silver what he had done to the boy, Booth said nothing and allowed Assistant Public Defender Fred Harro to give the details.

Bob Lambert, assistant scout executive for Monterey County, stressed Wednesday that the outing was not sanctioned by the Boy Scouts of America, who require that two adults be present on such occasions, and that the boys involved were not scouts themselves.

Booth's troop, which is sponsored by the Salinas Rotary Club, is still "going strong," Lambert said.






