Custodian suspended

DORRIS — The Butte Valley Unified School District Board Thursday suspended a high school custodian without pay following his arrest earlier in the week on a charge of lewd and lascivious conduct with a child under the age of 14 years.

Bill Cope, 48, 325 S. Butte St., was booked last Tuesday at the Siskiyou County Jail in Yreka on the charge.

Some 15 parents attended Thursday night's meeting to demand a guarantee that Cope would not be rehired by the school district. However, Arnold Torrigino, super-

intendent of schools, said the school board took the only action it could under its policies at this time and that any further action would have to await "due process."

In another matter at Thursday night's school board meeting, Torrigino unveiled next year's proposed budget of some \$2,392,000, up some 7 percent from the current year.

The board also set school calendar dates for next year including a Sept. 2 first day of school and June 6 completion date. Teachers will start their inservice training Aug. 27.

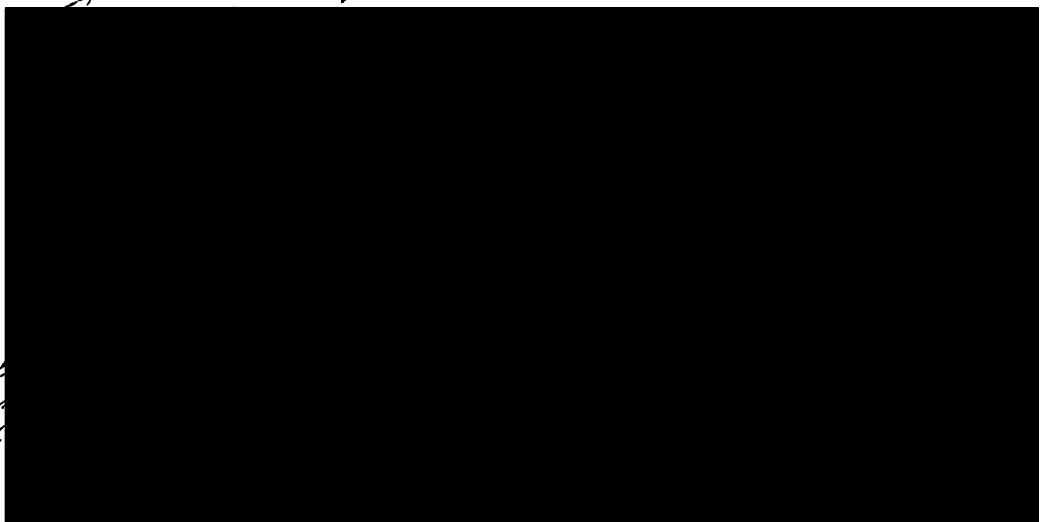

Dear Dan:

I was recently given a copy of a letter which you sent to the Risk Management Department of the national office concerning William Burke Cope. Since this involved a problem in registration, it was referred to me so that we could communicate.

According to the information which was sent, we would not wish to register Mr. Cope with the Boy Scouts of America and have him work with youth members. The newspaper articles indicate that he was suspended from his job and had been indicted.

We would like the outcome of any further legal action which has taken place so that we would know whether he was convicted and sentenced for these offenses.

I would certainly suggest that you complete a Confidential Record Sheet, which I am enclosing, so that we are able to identify Mr. Cope should a registration attempt come from any other location. We would also like any other information you might have which would help us to make certain we have a case which will be strong enough to refuse registration attempts.

Please let us know if we may be of help to you.

Dear Judge Bigler:

After reviewing the order of probation that was entered in the above matter, my client called my attention to the fact that it appears that the probation was for a violation of Section 272.3(a) of the Penal Code, which was in error. There is no such section in the Penal Code, and the charge was actually amended to a violation of Section 273(a)(2) of the Penal Code which provides that any person who permits such child to be placed in such situation that its person or health may be endangered is guilty of a misdemeanor.

I have discussed this matter with Charles Slote, the Siskiyou County District Attorney, and confirmed with him the amendment as I have stated it, and I would appreciate it very much if the record could be corrected and a new probation order issued reflecting the proper charge.

This is extremely important to my client because of his position as custodian with the Dorris School District. If you need anything of a more formal entry to be filed with the court, please let me know and I will do whatever is required.

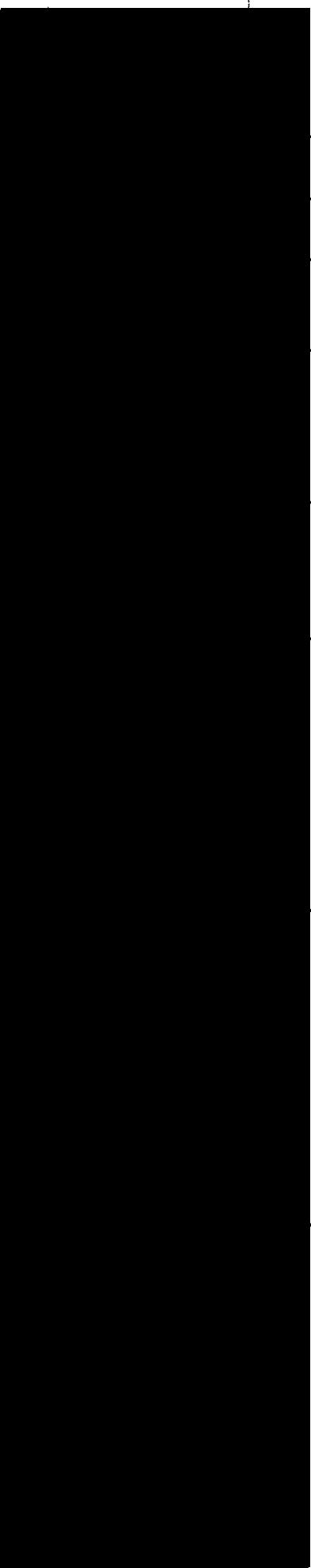
